From the Rabbi

“Obligations without Measure: Welcoming the Stranger” (from the daily prayers)

We who are parents or teachers instill in our children early on a sense of “stranger danger.” For their own safety we want children to understand that just because someone is friendly does not mean that individual is trustworthy. We err on the side of caution – whether it is accepting a home-baked Halloween treat, taking help from a kindly man or woman, or opening the door to anyone who rings – our children learn from us to be careful. And this is completely appropriate in an age when we don’t live in small villages where everyone is familiar and when the dangers and possibilities of harm are multiplied.

We at the synagogue aren’t immune from this caution. In a world filled with hate and violence, we are taking appropriate measures to maximize the safety of everyone that enters. We balance this appropriate modern concern with our ancient mandate as Jews to welcome the stranger, to provide hospitality and warmth to all who seek a place in our community. The obligation for hospitality emerges from those first Jews, Abraham and Sarah. Abraham, sitting in the opening of his tent, sees travelers and he and Sarah provide them with food and drink – and even wash their feet! The Passover Seder begins with the familiar words “Let all who are hungry come and eat.” Along with honoring parents, burying the dead, and studying Torah, welcoming the stranger is mentioned as a fundamental obligation in our daily and Shabbat prayer book. Even the tradition of saying Kiddush in the synagogue (and not only at home) on Friday night began so as to make sure that travelers and strangers would have a community with whom to bless the wine.

Our annual Open House on Aug. 14, gives us at Beth Shalom the chance to fulfill this essential mitzvah. The word “us” is important. The obligation of welcoming is not one that can be passed off to an institution. It belongs to each and every one of us. What does that mean? It means that each of us is a member of the membership committee, a greeter, an open hand (and heart) of welcome. How can you live up to that Jewish obligation? Pass along news of the Open House to a neighbor, co-worker or friend – and bring that friend to the Open House. Spread the news on your Facebook page, send an email or make a phone call. Think how much more likely you are to take the risk of going to a new place if you are invited and accompanied by someone you know rather than simply responding to an advertisement? People respond to friends and acquaintances – to relationships – more than to cold words on paper.

Live up to the traditions of Abraham and Sarah, the words of the Pesach seder, the obligations of Jewish tradition and welcome the stranger. As our new six-word congregational tag line now says: *Once we were strangers, strangers no more.* You can make that happen.

How many rooms do we enter and no one turns around? In how many instances have we acted and our actions were deemed unimportant?"


I can speak from our eight years of experience that when







LIFELONG LEARNING—Sheila Fishman



On Sunday, Sept. 11, at 4 p.m., the Lifelong Learning Committee of the Congregation Beth Shalom of Brandon will present a lecture and slide program on JEWISH ART HISTORY with Susan Fader. Mrs. Fader is the daughter of Holocaust survivors. Years after coming to America, her parents became art dealers and collectors. Mrs. Fader grew up surrounded by paintings and sculptures. Born in the Bronx, she was raised in Newton, Massachusetts. She is a life-long professional artist with a degree from the Philadelphia College of Art. Prior to receiving her degree, she attended the Rhode Island School of Design. Before retiring in Florida, with her husband, she owned and operated, three art-related businesses. She now enjoys working as a staff art instructor in a 55+ community. In addition, she teaches art at libraries and other adult education programs.

Mrs. Fader has said “art history has a power that goes beyond traditional history. Directly connecting the artists’ art with the historical events surrounding them adds another dimension to how one thinks about history and a deeper understanding of mankind.”

Her chronological examination of Jewish Art History will begin with a look at the origins of Jewish Art and how the 2nd Commandment played a role in its evolution. We will begin with Ceremonial Objects, Mosaics, Haggadah and Illuminated Manuscripts created by Jewish craftsmen. Essential to the overall study of Jewish art, Mrs. Fader will address Jewish art created by artists from the 16th, 17th and 18th centuries. After speaking about those important artists, the focus will turn to the 1930s. We will learn about artists of victims and survivors of WWII and how their art reflects their individual experiences. Included in this portion of the talk will be the work of well-known artists, and the poignant art of others less known. The presentation will end with a look at artwork by Jewish artists of the 1950s to present time. Their art will provide an understanding of how Jewish culture and history continues to be expressed through their work. A recommended reading, and a list of the artists discussed will be available to attendees. There is no cost for admission, but a donation to Congregation Beth Shalom of \$10 is suggested.



KOLOT SHOLOM NOTES

There is grief. There is silence. There is sadness for what could have been. There is conflict. There is mourning in our family. I contemplate sitting shiva.

In so many ways, this feels like a memorial for a lost era. There are few survivors who can relate those distant years. What sadness has occurred? Who was affected?

The event happened following Kristallnacht. Shot down in its prime, this uniquely cultural phase of Jewish history was disturbed for all time. Our Jewish community lost so much on that night, and yet this one event has been greatly overlooked.

The event I am speaking of is the loss of the great Jewish Organs, Organ Composers and Organists of the 1930's and 40's.

"So what?" many Jews say. "The organ was only an instrument of the Christian Church, an instrument that Jews in Germany used to help them feel more like their neighbors and countryman."

Not so, my dear loved ones. The Jewish Organ had an earlier past before the Christian Churches, and it had a wealth of repertoire that expanded like that of the Church for many years. In addition, let's not forget the many Jewish Organists and Composers who were sent to the concentration camps or emigrated to a land that had no need of their talents.

When I first joined Congregation B'nai Israel in Bridgeport, Connecticut, I joined as a member and later as the Temple Organist for a short period of time. I thrilled to the sound of the organ accompaniment along with the voice of our well-known Cantor, Ramon Gilbert. The music had the nuances of Jewish modes led by a Cantor that brought us close to the feet of the Holy One.

So what happened to our Organ and Choral music? How has congregational choir music been affected? Two years ago, at Mifgash, I was able to have this discussion with many Temple Musicians. However, there was not an in-depth workshop. So I feel we only circled the subject.

In the next month, I will engage in a process of investigation. I hope you will also research this matter. I'm sure this will lead to an enriched congregational discussion. I would appreciate your remembrances as well.

Donations

Congregation Beth Shalom accepts donations for many purposes, with a variety of opportunities for donors to support the good works of the Temple. You may contact the office either by phone or email to make a contribution, or head to our website to make a secure online payment through a PayPal account or by using a credit card.

Funds:

- **General Fund** (unrestricted): An unrestricted gift to the General Fund allows the temple to use those funds wherever they may be needed most. This fund incorporates contributions received from our High Holy Day Appeal, Yahrzeit donations, Bricklets, Adopt-A-Book, Tree of Life (unless otherwise indicated) and other non-restricted gifts.
- **Building Fund:** A fund to ensure the continuing physical growth of our spiritual home. Intended for capital improvements and major building repairs.
- **Endowment Fund:** Gifts to this fund are placed in an investment account and temporarily restricted or can be defined/restricted by the donor. This fund ensures the future of our temple.
- **Religious School Scholarship Fund:** These funds will be made available to Religious School students who are in need of tuition assistance, as determined confidentially by the Treasurer.
- **Rabbi's Discretionary Fund:** a fund for assistance to families in need, scholarship assistance, interfaith council, Holocaust museum and other endeavors at the Rabbi's discretion.
- **Youth Group Fund:** a fund that supports the ongoing engagement of post b'nai mitzvah youth, providing meaningful and fun experiences for our teens, and keeping them connected to their Jewish community.

If you wish to designate a gift to a particular purpose, for example, Food Bank, Choir, Oneg, Social Action, etc., you may do so by noting as such on your payment method or with an accompanying note; otherwise, your gift will be used where it is needed most.

Opportunities:

- **Adopt-A-Book:** A dedication label will be placed in one of our prayer books, to commemorate a simcha or in honor or memory of a loved one for just \$54.
- **Bricklets:** For as little as \$9 you can send a Bricklet Card instead of buying a card for birthdays, condolences, etc. A Bricklet Card in your name will be sent to the person you wish stating that a donation has been made in his or her name to Beth Shalom to honor the occasion.
- **Tree of Life:** The Tree of Life is on the back wall of our Sanctuary. An engraved leaf or stone can commemorate many simchas, b'nai mitzvah, wedding, birth, graduations, etc. Leaves are \$180, and stones are \$1800.
- **Yahrzeit Plaque:** To honor the death of a loved one, you may purchase a plaque that will be cared for in perpetuity for \$250. The name of the deceased along with their date of death is included on the plaque.


