From the Rabbi

I Dare You To . . .

There are few places today, outside of the State of Israel, where it is safer to be a Jew than in the United States of America. While of course anti-Semitism exists, attitudes toward Jews are overwhelmingly positive. In all professions and walks of life there are Jews in leadership positions; laws protect us from discrimination and bigotry; and the free and open nature of American society has



promoted a flourishing of Jewish creativity and diversity. And yet, many of us are hesitant to publicly identify as Jews.

I proudly put my UT25 magnet on my car bumper . . . I know that most people did not wish to do so. Many of you tell me that when in airports or public places you won't wear a Star of David or an identifying Jewish symbol. To be sure, we are proud to be Jews. At the same time, we don't always go out of our way to share this essential and intrinsic part of our identity. Lingering anti-Semitism and the insecurity of being a minority makes us cautious, despite living in the most open and accepting country in the world.

This is the month to overcome that insecurity – to "put yourself out there as a Jew." August 23 is our annual open house – an opportunity to learn about our first rate Religious School, our myriad of social and educational programs, the joyous spiritual life that is the foundation of the CBS family. Those who are members look forward to the opportunity to reconnect, to greet each other after summer travels. However, the key word in open house is ... open! This is our opportunity to share the impact and value of CBS with those who have yet to discover us. And for that, we need you. You are the best advertisement for Beth Shalom.

What does that mean? That means sharing about your Jewish life with the neighbor who you noticed had a Chanukah menorah in her window. It means approaching the work colleague who says that her husband is Jewish and inviting them to the open house. It means sharing who you are as a Jew with interfaith families, LGBT individuals and couples, singles and families – and assuring them that everyone has a place at Beth Shalom. It means calling up someone you know, and inviting them to come with you on August 23 to learn about the community that has been integral to you and your Jewish life.

We are sensitive to appearing to *recruit*, having sometimes been on the receiving end of such recruitment. We are sometimes reluctant to seem overly zealous as a Jew, lest we open ourselves us up to discrimination. I understand these fears. But without our willingness to share our passion about Beth Shalom with others, we cannot reach our potential. And that means sharing who you are as a Jew as well. Reach out to two or more people, share your love of Beth Shalom with them, the impact the synagogue has had on your Jewish life and invite them to accompany you to the open house. I dare you.

Mark your calenars...from Selichot thorugh Shimini Atzaret—join us in worship during the High Holy Days! The schedule is inside this Kibbitzer, as well as on our website!

How would I know what I am missing?

This is the 3rd part of my 4 part series on the knowledge of my grandparents.

Today I get to talk about my favorite – my mom's mom, Frieda. She had a sarcastic, razor-sharp wit and a keen memory.

She always told us she would jump out of her 6th floor apartment if we married a non-Jew. She was always pushing us to stay in the faith, but listen to this story she imparted to us on the East River Drive while driving to her house:

Grandma Frieda was part of a social club. Frenchy, as she was called, had an active social life. She told us she even dated a few non-Jews and kissed them. I asked her how she could kiss non-Jews after her adamant stand on marrying them. She waited 20 seconds and then wisecracked, "how else would I know what I am missing."

My grandmother always knew a good punch line.

Our Open House is in August. We will have all the different committees outreaching to our current and new members to get involved. We need new blood to infuse our temple with new ideas, energy and leadership. We need to have our current temple friendships to intermingle and create a stronger temple.

If we all stay in our little cocoon of the familiar, of the safe, then we will never know what we have missed out on. If I had not tried teaching 5th grade religious school 14 years ago, I would have missed out on 8 years of great memories and learning. If I had not tried out leadership in our temple, I would not have forged the solid relationships and experiences I have today.

My grandmother's words also speak of inclusivity of our temple. I am very proud that we are a diverse, open Jewish community and we strive to continue these practices. We welcome Jews from all walks of life and we respect individual viewpoints and lifestyles. We gain from the different experiences of others. It was my grandmother's way of saying that we all need to learn from others and experience things that are new to us. She was funny and wise...a great combination for all of us.

Rabbi Prinz recently served the Central Conference of American Rabbis as Director of Program and Member Services and the Director of the Joint Commission on Rabbinic Mentoring, having held a number of leadership positions in the national and regional Reform movement. Elected by her colleagues, Rabbi Prinz held each office of the Board of the Pacific Association of Reform Rabbis and assumed its presidency in 2005. For many years she served as a member of the Executive Committee of the U.R.J.-C.C.A.R. Commission on Outreach & Synagogue Community. The Rabbi Emerita of Temple Adat Shalom, Poway, California, she served as its Senior Rabbi for almost twenty years. Prior to that she was, for seven years, the Rabbi of a synagogue in Bergen County, New Jersey, and also the Assistant Rabbi of Central Synagogue in Manhattan. She has delivered many talks to community organizations. During her almost thirty years in congregational work, Rabbi Prinz contributed to the local Jewish community as well. In 1991, she was named "Woman of the Year" by Brandeis University National Women's Committee.

Rabbi Prinz's book, On the Chocolate Trail: A Delicious Adventure Connecting Jews, Religions, History, Travel, Rituals and Recipes to the Magic of Cacao, was published in 2013 by Jewish Lights and is already in its third printing. Rabbi Prinz lectures about chocolate and religion around the world. The book is being used in adult study, classroom settings, book clubs and chocolate tastings. Her book stirs age -old passions for chocolate and religion using information gathered from travel in several countries, including Belgium, Egypt, England, France, Israel, Italy, Mexico, Spain, Switzerland and the United States. It spans several cultures, countries, centuries, and religions, exploring how faith traditions share consumption, ritual and business interests in chocolate. Shalom! As we approach the beginning of another Jewish year, we take time to reflect on the past year and how we have lived our lives as Jews. Our congregation continues to be a Jewish home for our community. As we move into our 26th year we look forward to our future and all that the years will bring to Beth Shalom. This year the High Holidays bring an opportunity for hospitality and building relationships. As the model set out by Abraham and Sarah, we can be a welcoming tent where new and old can experience our community in a Jewishly meaningful way.

The High Holidays are always a busy time at Beth Shalom! Included is our High Holiday schedule. I encourage you to attend the Selichot play featuring another original play acted by the Beth Shalom Players. Donations

Congregation Beth Shalom accepts donations for many purposes, with a variety of opportunities for donors to support the good works of the Temple. You may contact the office either by phone or email to make a contribution, or head to our website to make a secure online payment through a PayPal account or by using a credit card.

Funds:

- General Fund (unrestricted): An unrestricted gift to the General Fund allows the temple to use those funds wherever they may be needed most. This fund incorporates contributions received from our High Holy Day Appeal, Yahrzeit donations, Bricklets, Adopt-A-Book, Tree of Life (unless otherwise indicated) and other nonrestricted gifts.
- **Building Fund:** A fund to ensure the continuing physical growth of our spiritual home. Intended for capital improvements and major building repairs.
- Endowment Fund: Gifts to this fund are placed in an investment account and temporarily restricted or can be defined/ restricted by the donor. This fund ensures the future of our temple.
- Religious School Scholarship Fund: These funds will be made available to Religious School students who are in need of tuition assistance, as determined confidentially by the Treasurer.
- **Rabbi's Discretionary Fund**: a fund for assistance to families in need, scholarship assistance, interfaith council, Holocaust museum and other endeavors at the Rabbi's discretion.

If you wish to designate a gift to a particular purpose, for example, Food Bank, Choir, Oneg, Social Action, etc., you may do so by noting as such on your payment method or with an accompanying note; otherwise, your gift will be used where it is needed most. Opportunities:

Adopt-A-Book: A dedication label will be placed in one of our prayer books, to commemorate a simcha or in honor or memory of a loved one for just \$54.

- Bricklets: For as little as \$9 you can send a Bricklet Card instead of buying a card for birthdays, condolences, etc. A Bricklet Card in your name will be sent to the person you wish stating that a donation has been made in his or her name to Beth Shalom to honor the occasion.
- **Tree of Life**: The Tree of Life is on the back wall of our Sanctuary. An engraved leaf or stone can commemorate many simchas, b'nai mitzvah, wedding, birth, graduations, etc. Leaves are \$180, and stones are \$1800.
- **Yahrzeit Plaque**: To honor the death of a loved one, you may purchase a plaque that will be cared for in perpetuity for \$250. The name of the deceased along with their date of death is included on the plaque.

Unless otherwise noted by you, your gift will be acknowledged in the Kibbitzer the month following its receipt. If your donation is incorrectly listed or omitted, please notify the temple office immediately.


