Learning from Old Commercials!

It was so good, I told two friends...

There was a famous commercial in the 1980s for Fabergé Organic Shampoo. Even if you don't remember the brand, you may well remember the commercial (which featured the actress Heather Locklear). "When I first tried Fabergé Organics Shampoo with pure wheat germ oil and honey, it was so good I told two friends about it.



And they told two friends. And so on, and so on..." As the actress "tells two friends and so on and so on," her picture multiplies repeatedly on the screen. The commercial, with its simple graphics and 80s hair-styles, is hilariously dated, but the idea is as true today as 30 years ago. The best way to share something that we value, something about which we are excited and enthusiastic, is by word of mouth. We share that excitement with a friend, and then it grows and grows. **That's why we need you to help with the Open House this month.** We will advertise the Open House in the paper, announce it from the *bimah* and put up flyers. But you have the ability to do more than any of these when you share your experience at Beth Shalom with a friend — your enthusiasm for the Religious School, the feeling of warmth that you get when you enter, the joy that embraces you on Holy Days. When you think about the person who reached out to you, who brought you in to Beth Shalom (or to another organization that you value), you understand the potential that you have. Tell two friends about Beth Shalom and our Open House on August 17. And they'll tell two friends. And so on. It will make a difference to them – and to us as well.

Hold the Pickles, Hold the Lettuce...

All of you who remember the 70s (my era!) can finish this Burger King jingle: special orders don't upset us all; all we ask is that you let us serve it YOUR way. Long before the supreme individualism of today's society, this catchy jingle told us that we needn't order "one size fits all," that our own tastes, needs, and opinions matter. (Remember Sally wanting everything on the side in the movie, When Harry Met Sally?) This year we are bringing this same principle to Adult Learning. I recognize that some of us don't have time for a series of three evening classes. Maybe you'd rather learn about creation and science over a cup of coffee with a couple of friends in the afternoon. Maybe you'd like to bring a few friends together at home for one night to discuss a topic that you have been debating (what does Judaism say about tattoos)? You might be a person who wants to discuss a deeply personal topic such as whether one needs to believe in God, or someone who wants a more hands-on experience such as learning to bake a challah. Are you an English buff who would like a few sessions on Jews in Shakespearean literature? Part of our Adult Learning program this year will be a "design your own" program — the topic, the time, the group — it's all up to you. Watch for invitations explaining this new program and start brainstorming. Let us serve it your way to nourish your own unique and individual Jewish spirit and mind.

Proud to be Frugal..

I AM $\,$ PROUD TO BE FRUGAL - Not cheap, but frugal to the core.

I always buy generics instead of name-brand products (unless we have a BOGO at Publix), eat at Subway for their value meal, shop at COSTCO in bulk, and refuse to buy orange juice for my kids at restaurants. I do not take the new connector on the Selmon, and I never spend too much for clothes. Dollars are treated like gold, and I hate to part with money unless there is true *value*. (*Editor's note: It's all true!*) Over the next few Kibbitzer issues, I will be reminding you of the *value* of CBS Membership.

Organizations asking me to part with hard-earned cash are informed of two principles:

- I want to know that the organization does not waste the money and is as frugal as I am.
- I need to feel a connection to the organization.

I invite you to come to a board meeting or committee meeting or talk with a board member to see how we treat your hard-earned dollars — you will no doubt be assured that it is with the utmost respect. Our treasurer, our administrator and yours truly (along with the board) scrutinize all major (and not so major) expenses. We have renegotiated URJ MUM (Maintenance of Union Membership) dues, the mortgage and service contracts have and gained efficiency by avoiding duplication. We address the needs of all the constituents of our congregation fairly and frugally. We turn off lights, recycle, reuse, reorganize. Every decision is put through the prism of knowing you worked hard for those dollars.

Why do I tell you this?

Over the next few months, we will start our biggest fundraiser, the High Holiday Drive. Without this initiative, we would not be able to thrive as a congregation. The programs and services we currently offer would have to be cut or discontinued. So as one frugal person to another I make this pledge:

I (and others working on the High Holiday Drive) would never ask you to spend your hard-earned dollars on CBS if we did not treat your money like it was ours. I respect money too much, and I know how difficult it is to spend in our stagnant economy.

Next month, I will tell you ways we can rebuild our connections in the temple together. Twenty-five years ago, CBS was founded on connections, and in order for us to thrive we need to strengthen those connections. If you give us the time, we will find the ways to connect with you.

After all, I treat time like money — frugally...

Shalom! As we approach the beginning of another Jewish year, we take time to reflect on the past year and how we have lived our lives as Jews. Our congregation continues to be a Jewish home for our community. Our President's focus on building community and reaching inward to each other is especially important this High Holy Day season. As we enter 5775, we have the opportunity to consider our past, change our present, and build for the future. May the coming year be lived in a Jewishly meaningful way.

The High Holidays are always a busy time at Beth Shalom. Included is our High Holiday schedule. I encourage you to attend the Selichot play, which will provide insight into the lives of the characters from previous plays. The Beth Shalom Players are looking forward to sharing with you. We will again offer our full complement of services for Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur, including children's/family services for both holidays. Immediately following Yom Kippur we celebrate Sukkot, and then close the High Holiday season with our Simchat Torah celebration. Again this year we will be celebrating Sukkot "Under the Stars," with special activities for our youth, who we hope, will bring a friend with them as a celebration of welcoming ushpizim (guests) as part of Sukkot.

You should be receiving your High Holiday packets in the mail, where you will find additional information inside about High Holiday traditions and customs, as well as our usual materials, including information about our Tree of Life and yahrzeit plaque opportunities. Also, for those who observe Yizkor, PLEASE remember to fill out the Book of Remembrance (BOR) form and follow the instructions for returning it. Add any new names you wish to have read as part of the service. If you had names included in the Book last year, you should have had

those names included with your BOR form in this year's packet. Please take a moment to check the names and spellings to ensure there are no errors (if there are, please correct and return—if there are not, please still return the form!). Copies of this form will be included in the Kibbitzer, the High Holiday packet, and can be obtained at the synagogue.

Finally, be sure to look at the upcoming weekly email blasts and our congregational Facebook page for special High Holiday information. If you have High Holiday questions or needs, please feel free to contact me as ritual chair at kvergon@verizon.net.


Here's how it works:

- 3. We do the research of market value, take photos, write the description and list the item on online auctions or (in the case of large items like furniture) consignors.
- 4. The proceeds go to the CBS general fund to help defray our programs and overhead.
 - **★** Win-win: You get rid of something you no longer wish to keep; you get the deduction; and the synagogue gets the proceeds of the sale. **★**

- Furniture Gently used without damage, retro, mid-century modern, antique, oriental carpets, designer accent pieces.



Donations

Congregation Beth Shalom accepts donations for many purposes, with a variety of opportunities for donors to support the good works of the Temple. You may contact the office either by phone or email to make a contribution, or head to our website to make a secure online payment through a PayPal account or by using a credit card.

Funds:

- General Fund (unrestricted): An unrestricted gift to the General Fund allows the temple to use those funds wherever they may be needed most. This fund incorporates contributions received from our High Holy Day Appeal, Yahrzeit donations, Bricklets, Adopt-A-Book, Tree of Life (unless otherwise indicated) and other non-restricted gifts.
- Building Fund: A fund to ensure the continuing physical growth of our spiritual home. Intended for capital improvements and major building repairs.
- Endowment Fund: Gifts to this fund are placed in an investment account and temporarily restricted or can be defined/ restricted by the donor. This fund ensures the future of our temple.
- Religious School Scholarship Fund: These funds will be made available to Religious School students who are in need of tuition assistance, as determined confidentially by the Treasurer.
- Rabbi's Discretionary Fund: a fund for assistance to families in need, scholarship assistance, interfaith council, Holocaust museum and other endeavors at the Rabbi's discretion.

If you wish to designate a gift to a particular purpose, for example, Food Bank, Choir, Oneg, Social Action, etc., you may do so by noting as such on your payment method or with an accompanying note; otherwise, your gift will be used where it is needed most.

Opportunities:

- Adopt-A-Book: A dedication label will be placed in one of our prayer books, to commemorate a simcha or in honor or memory of a loved one for just \$54.
- Bricklets: For as little as \$9 you can send a Bricklet Card instead of buying a card for birthdays, condolences, etc. A Bricklet Card in your name will be sent to the person you wish stating that a donation has been made in his or her name to Beth Shalom to honor the occasion.
- Tree of Life: The Tree of Life is on the back wall of our Sanctuary. An engraved leaf or stone can commemorate many simchas, b'nai mitzvah, wedding, birth, graduations, etc. Leaves are \$180, and stones are \$1800.
- Yahrzeit Plaque: To honor the death of a loved one, you may purchase a plaque that will be cared for in perpetuity for \$250. The name of the deceased along with their date of death is included on the plaque.

Unless otherwise noted by you, your gift will be acknowledged in the Kibbitzer the month following its receipt. If your donation is incorrectly listed or omitted, please notify the temple office immediately.
