From the Rabbi

Chanukah is more than 'Mensch on the Bench' or Hanukkah Harry

The history of Chanukah is complex. While we imagine that the Jews are united against the Syrian-Greeks, in fact there were serious disagreements about how to respond to the oppression of the Emperor Antiochus. While the story of "just enough oil for one day but it burned for eight" is central to our observance of Chanukah, it's not in the book of the Maccabees, which is the primary historical source for the story. Dreidels are not intrinsic to the origins of the holiday either!

On the other hand, the message of Chanukah as we observe it today isn't complicated at all. It's simple and essential to our self-understanding. There have always been those who have tried to eradicate the Jewish customs and traditions that are essential to our identity as Jews. Our ancestors fought for the right to live fully as Jews – and on Chanukah we remember this fight and embrace the gift of spiritual freedom that is our inheritance.

If Chanukah is to be more than a commercial expression of the Christmas season, more than a 'we get presents on eight days' message to our children, than we must look seriously at the essential truth of this minor holiday. It diminishes one of the messages of Chanukah – that our ancestors fought and died for our right to live as Jews – if we don't take the message of Jewish living seriously. Jewish living means many, many things of course, but I want to highlight just two.

First, and most obviously, we need to *live as fully as Jews as possible*. What is the point of our ancestors fighting for our right to observe Shabbat and Kashrut, Jewish learning and customs, if we ignore these very things? Observing Chanukah may begin with lighting a Chanukiah, but it doesn't end there. It continues in the living of a full Jewish life.

Secondly, it means *living the values of Judaism*. The list is long of course, but driving many of our values is the message that *every person is made in the image of God*. That means that every individual – even those with whom we disagree or those we do not like – is worthy of honor. Moreover, if we don't respect others – of different races and religions, creeds and colors – as fully God's children, then we are rejecting the essence of Judaism no matter how often we come to Shabbat services. This is about our own behavior to be sure, but not *only* our own behavior. If we don't speak out when we hear others – even friends, members of our family and fellow congregants – speaking in ways that are disrespectful of any person – then we are accomplices in that behavior.

Chanukah is a wonderful holiday to be sure – filled with family, food, light and joy. It reminds us that light can shine in the darkness, that the few can defeat the many, that there are things that are so important that they are worthy of sacrifice and risk. But if these are just abstract notions, than we miss the point. Chanukah must impel us to live and act fully as Jews, and to always stand up for the essential values of Jewish tradition. Respect and kindness for all is one of these core values, taught by Torah and the essence of God. May Chanukah inspire us to live up these mandates long after the wax has been cleaned off of our menorahs.

I am so excited about the opportunities in which I participated in November. I had the unique privilege to be involved in many different learning events last month. I attended the URJ Biennial in Orlando. I had the chance to spend 3 days completely engaged in a Jewish Community. The keynote speakers and services were inspiring. Most of the breakout sessions I went to involved topics that directly related to religious youth education. I also attended the Rabbi's adult education classes that were held on Tuesday evenings. Her topic was also centered on educating our youth. In addition, the annual Tampa Bay Jewish Educators' Council Teacher In-Service was held on November 22. The keynote speaker addressed how to meet the needs of all students by differentiating curriculum and incorporating accommodations for students when appropriate. I will be meeting with our religious school teachers in December to share ideas, programs and strategies to enhance the learning of all students.

Last month our 2nd and 3rd graders (with their parents) participated in a Family Program led by the Rabbi. They explored the notion of being a "Mitzvah Super Hero." This timely lesson came right before Mitzvah Day. Thanks to all who came out to support our community on November 15. We all know that children lead by example. One of our school goals is to raise Jewish adults. Tikkun olam, repairing the world and G'milut Chasadim (acts of loving kindness) are values we teach in school and can model on Mitzvah Day and all year long.

Jewish immigration to America will be reviewed from colonial times to the present. Some widely held myths about Jewish Genealogy will be dispelled. Easy to use tools, techniques, and resources for research will be identified and demonstrated. Examples of a variety of current and historical genealogical documents will be provided. The program will be followed by Dinner with the Tribe.



Donations

Congregation Beth Shalom accepts donations for many purposes, with a variety of opportunities for donors to support the good works of the Temple. You may contact the office either by phone or email to make a contribution, or head to our website to make a secure online payment through a PayPal account or by using a credit card.

Funds:

- **General Fund** (unrestricted): An unrestricted gift to the General Fund allows the temple to use those funds wherever they may be needed most. This fund incorporates contributions received from our High Holy Day Appeal, Yahrzeit donations, Bricklets, Adopt-A-Book, Tree of Life (unless otherwise indicated) and other non-restricted gifts.
- **Building Fund:** A fund to ensure the continuing physical growth of our spiritual home. Intended for capital improvements and major building repairs.
- **Endowment Fund:** Gifts to this fund are placed in an investment account and temporarily restricted or can be defined/restricted by the donor. This fund ensures the future of our temple.
- **Religious School Scholarship Fund:** These funds will be made available to Religious School students who are in need of tuition assistance, as determined confidentially by the Treasurer.
- **Rabbi's Discretionary Fund:** a fund for assistance to families in need, scholarship assistance, interfaith council, Holocaust museum and other endeavors at the Rabbi's discretion.

If you wish to designate a gift to a particular purpose, for example, Food Bank, Choir, Oneg, Social Action, etc., you may do so by noting as such on your payment method or with an accompanying note; otherwise, your gift will be used where it is needed most.

Opportunities:

- **Adopt-A-Book:** A dedication label will be placed in one of our prayer books, to commemorate a simcha or in honor or memory of a loved one for just \$54.
- **Bricklets:** For as little as \$9 you can send a Bricklet Card instead of buying a card for birthdays, condolences, etc. A Bricklet Card in your name will be sent to the person you wish stating that a donation has been made in his or her name to Beth Shalom to honor the occasion.
- **Tree of Life:** The Tree of Life is on the back wall of our Sanctuary. An engraved leaf or stone can commemorate many simchas, b'nai mitzvah, wedding, birth, graduations, etc. Leaves are \$180, and stones are \$1800.
- **Yahrzeit Plaque:** To honor the death of a loved one, you may purchase a plaque that will be cared for in perpetuity for \$250. The name of the deceased along with their date of death is included on the plaque.
