The Circle of Life

The nature of life in a small congregation such as Beth Shalom is that our life cycle celebrations tend to be spread out - a baby naming one month, maybe a Bat Mitzvah the next, and then a month or two without any individual life cycle events. However, in the period between Thanksgiving and today when I write this Kibbitzer article (Dec. 14 - a few days late, admittedly!) we have celebrated the full array of life cycle moments. We welcomed a baby into the covenant and gave her the gift of a Hebrew name. A young man took his place as a committed and responsible member of the Jewish people. After a lengthy period of study, one of our members entered the Covenant of the Jewish people. We celebrated a beautiful Jewish wedding right in our sanctuary. And we have grieved and mourned with many of our families at funerals, memorial services and shivas. All of this in less than four weeks. The confluence of these meaningful moments has been, for many of us, a reminder of the intermingling of joy and sorrow, celebration and loss. As we name a baby, or celebrate a conversion, someone is mourning a beloved parent or preparing to say good-bye. We have truly come to understand what the breaking of the glass at the wedding teaches - the fragility of life even at times of joy.

There is, however, one constant that has amazed me time and again over the past month. The willingness of our community to open their hearts - to rejoice and comfort fully, to help those celebrating and support those who are mourning - is truly remarkable. One might think that "compassion fatigue" would set in, that we would get tired of being asked to help set up, clean up, make calls, bring a cake. But nothing could be farther from the truth. We have had members serve as witnesses at a mikvah, help with oneg Shabbats and Kiddush lunches and set up food for mourners. People have helped in public and private ways, in ways known and unknown. As I write this article, members are discussing a special Oneg in memory of our beloved long time member Sophie Brenner, who died at the age of 99. All of this, of course, is in addition to the many things our members do day in and day out to support the daily life of Congregation Beth Shalom from folding Kibbitzers to planning Chanukah celebrations to leading services.

When we reach life's major milestones, we think about them mainly as our own events - things that happen to us, to our children, our parents. They are special occasions for "our" family. To be sure, that is true. But the past month has reminded me - and hopefully the rest of us - that family is a fluid term. The milestones we mark on our individual paths intersect with the paths of our Temple family members, and with the life of the Jewish people represented by Congregation Beth Shalom. Above all else, that is what it is to be a community, to be united . . . together. For all that you continue to give to each other, I am grateful.

From the President - *Jeff Newman*

“Pray as if everything depended on G-d, Act as if everything depended on you”

Page 125 in our Shabbat siddur, gives me pause. I read it every week and think what I want to accomplish in my personal, professional and congregational life. This was my “aha” to understanding why we pray, how we must act, and that we can’t just wait around. This passage transformed not only my outlook on Judaism but on all aspects of my life.

When I moved to Brandon, I had already taught 5th grade for 4 years and was sending our kids to Religious School. It did not matter to me that I did not have an understanding on why we go to services or what the bigger picture was. I mean, I was doing the same thing my parents did, so I was covered in the book of life. As long as I did the minimum, I was golden in G-d’s hands.

I do not believe in luck—never have. You determine your own luck by being consistent, persistent and by putting yourself in the best possibility of success. This formula had worked well in my job and in raising my family. I never make excuses for things that I have control over. I could not understand how a person like myself, who believes in personal responsibility, could tie the spiritual, “out of my hands,” philosophy of religion.

That is why, seven years ago, the above phrase gave me the insight I needed to bridge prayer, Judaism and volunteerism together. It laid the foundation of why we pray (to organize our thoughts and actions), why we are proactive (you need to be responsible) in temple life, and still understand that G-d has a some part in our life course.

I now pray as a fully engaged Jew who understands it is ultimately up to me to forward our traditions to the next generation. It is about personal responsibility and organizing all aspects of our lives. We have a choice to be proactive and make things happen or to react and say it is out of our hands

I know which choice I make.







Donations

Congregation Beth Shalom accepts donations for many purposes, with a variety of opportunities for donors to support the good works of the Temple. You may contact the office either by phone or email to make a contribution, or head to our website to make a secure online payment through a PayPal account or by using a credit card.

Funds:

- **General Fund** (unrestricted): An unrestricted gift to the General Fund allows the temple to use those funds wherever they may be needed most. This fund incorporates contributions received from our High Holy Day Appeal, Yahrzeit donations, Bricklets, Adopt-A-Book, Tree of Life (unless otherwise indicated) and other non-restricted gifts.
- **Building Fund:** A fund to ensure the continuing physical growth of our spiritual home. Intended for capital improvements and major building repairs.
- **Endowment Fund:** Gifts to this fund are placed in an investment account and temporarily restricted or can be defined/restricted by the donor. This fund ensures the future of our temple.
- **Religious School Scholarship Fund:** These funds will be made available to Religious School students who are in need of tuition assistance, as determined confidentially by the Treasurer.
- **Rabbi's Discretionary Fund:** a fund for assistance to families in need, scholarship assistance, interfaith council, Holocaust museum and other endeavors at the Rabbi's discretion.

If you wish to designate a gift to a particular purpose, for example, Food Bank, Choir, Oneg, Social Action, etc., you may do so by noting as such on your payment method or with an accompanying note; otherwise, your gift will be used where it is needed most.

Opportunities:

- **Adopt-A-Book:** A dedication label will be placed in one of our prayer books, to commemorate a simcha or in honor or memory of a loved one for just \$54.
- **Bricklets:** For as little as \$9 you can send a Bricklet Card instead of buying a card for birthdays, condolences, etc. A Bricklet Card in your name will be sent to the person you wish stating that a donation has been made in his or her name to Beth Shalom to honor the occasion.
- **Tree of Life:** The Tree of Life is on the back wall of our Sanctuary. An engraved leaf or stone can commemorate many simchas, b'nai mitzvah, wedding, birth, graduations, etc. Leaves are \$180, and stones are \$1800.
- **Yahrzeit Plaque:** To honor the death of a loved one, you may purchase a plaque that will be cared for in perpetuity for \$250. The name of the deceased along with their date of death is included on the plaque.
