From the Rabbi

Making Your Road Trips Jewish

As many of you know, I spend *a lot* of time in the car. I live in Pinellas County and it takes me about an hour each way to get to Congregation Beth Shalom. A few years ago I resolved to try to make my time in the car more than just a chore; to find a way to breathe, relax and learn. I strive to pay particular attention while driving over the bridge to the



beautiful sparkling water that I am so fortunate to see every day. I often see rainbows and I always notice the moon driving home. I relax by listening to books.

While it took me a while to get used to this, it is now a part of my weekly ritual that sometimes even makes me look forward to getting in the car. And I have become a dedicated and devoted listener to podcasts – an amazing way to continue to learn and keep up with Jewish events. If you are going on a road trip – or plan to garden, hike, exercise or cook this summer – consider these excellent Jewish podcasts (all in English) to keep you company.

- 1. *Israel Story* is my favorite. It will sound familiar to those who listen to the NPR podcast, *This American Life*. It is the Israel version of TAL- modern stories, often told by real Israelis about daily life. It is non-political in nature and the beautiful true stories will draw you closer to Israel, the land and the people. Available on iTunes. For more Israel oriented podcasts, go to http://tlv1.fm/podcasts/. Covering politics, the arts, music- even a great Hebrew language program this is a varied assortment of fascinating programs, some with a particular political slant. The wonderful on-line Israeli news source, *The Times of Israel*, also offers a podcast.
- 2. Tablet Magazine defines itself as a "daily online magazine of Jewish news, ideas, and culture." It offers very diverse and wide-ranging articles from a great variety of authors. You can subscribe to the online magazine; its podcast, which has the same mission, is called *Vox Tablet* and can be accessed through the Tablet website: http://www.tabletmag.com/podcasts
- 3. If you are looking for more in-depth Jewish learning, the podcasts offered by the Shalom Hartman institute are excellent. They provide lectures by noted Jewish thinkers many about topics related to Israel, but also about holidays, Jewish belief and Jewish ideas. The podcasts can be found on their website www.hartman.org.il or accessed through itunes.
- 4. Finally, if you want a weekly update on the Torah portion as you are driving home from work or winding down on Friday night, listen to the brief (10 minutes or less), *On the Other Hand* by Rabbi Rick Jacobs, president of the Union for Reform Judaism. A great way to get in the spirit of Shabbat and keep up with the cycle of Torah. Accessible through iTunes or at http://www.reformjudaism.org/learning/podcasts

He would ask you to think about these questions:


- 1. Name the five wealthiest people in the world.

- 5. Name the last decade's worth of World Series winners.


Did you get them all right? Probably not.



Your Lifelong Learning Committee met for its first planning session on June 7 and I am so excited about the upcoming year.

As you already know, Page Turners will continue to meet on the third Monday of every other month beginning with September 19, 2016 at 6:00 p.m. Phyllis Newman will be leading the discussion. Bibles and Bagels will be offered on four Shabbat mornings with the first program being held on September 10 at 10:00 a.m. Come with an appetite for the body and soul. Additionally, Rabbi will be offering a year long series of discussions on several contemporary issues including a year long discussion on Jewish Values and the Israeli-Palestinian Conflict. New programming will include Hebrew for Adults presented by Rudina Richter on five Sunday mornings in September through October of this year. The first session will be on September 11 9:45 a.m. - 11:45 a.m.

Additionally, special emphasis for this year is being placed on the relationship of Jews in the Arts. We are so excited to announce several informative and entertaining events, which include a program to enhance our Understanding of Jewish Music in the Spring, a discussion on Jewish Film in January 2017, and a program on the Art of Jewish Foods. We also hope to present an evening of Jewish humor for your entertainment.

The year of Jews in the Arts will open with a presentation by Susan Fader on Sunday, September 11 at 4:00 p.m. Ms. Fader will be providing a chronological examination of Jewish Art History beginning with a look at the origins of Jewish art examining Ceremonial Objects, Mosaics, Haggadah and Illuminated Manuscripts since the second Temple. Ms Fader will also look at work created by artists from the 16th, 17th and 18th centuries. Then, her focus turns to the 1930s. We will learn about artists of victims and survivors of WWII, and how the art reflects their individual experiences. The program will end with a look at artwork

KOLOT SHOLOM NOTES

There is grief. There is silence. There is sadness for what could have been. There is conflict. There is mourning in our family. I contemplate sitting shiva.

In so many ways, this feels like a memorial for a lost era. There are few survivors who can relate those distant years. What sadness has occurred? Who was affected?

The event happened following Kristallnacht. Shot down in its prime, this uniquely cultural phase of Jewish history was disturbed for all time. Our Jewish community lost so much on that night, and yet this one event has been greatly overlooked.

The event I am speaking of is the loss of the great Jewish Organs, Organ Composers and Organists of the 1930's and 40's.

"So what?" many Jews say. "The organ was only an instrument of the Christian Church, an instrument that Jews in Germany used to help them feel more like their neighbors and countryman."

Not so, my dear loved ones. The Jewish Organ had an earlier past before the Christian Churches, and it had a wealth of repertoire that expanded like that of the Church for many years. In addition, let's not forget the many Jewish Organists and Composers who were sent to the concentration camps or emigrated to a land that had no need of their talents.

When I first joined Congregation B'nai Israel in Bridgeport, Connecticut, I joined as a member and later as the Temple Organist for a short period of time. I thrilled to the sound of the organ accompaniment along with the voice of our well-known Cantor, Ramon Gilbert. The music had the nuances of Jewish modes led by a Cantor that brought us close to the feet of the Holy One.

So what happened to our Organ and Choral music? How has congregational choir music been affected? Two years ago, at Mifgash, I was able to have this discussion with many Temple Musicians. However, there was not an in-depth workshop. So I feel we only circled the subject.

In the next month, I will engage in a process of investigation. I hope you will also research this matter. I'm sure this will lead to an enriched congregational discussion. I would appreciate your remembrances as well.



Donations

Congregation Beth Shalom accepts donations for many purposes, with a variety of opportunities for donors to support the good works of the Temple. You may contact the office either by phone or email to make a contribution, or head to our website to make a secure online payment through a PayPal account or by using a credit card.

Funds:

- General Fund (unrestricted): An unrestricted gift to the General Fund allows the temple to use those funds wherever they may be needed most. This fund incorporates contributions received from our High Holy Day Appeal, Yahrzeit donations, Bricklets, Adopt-A-Book, Tree of Life (unless otherwise indicated) and other non-restricted gifts.
- Building Fund: A fund to ensure the continuing physical growth of our spiritual home. Intended for capital improvements and major building repairs.
- Endowment Fund: Gifts to this fund are placed in an investment account and temporarily restricted or can be defined/restricted by the donor. This fund ensures the future of our temple.
- Religious School Scholarship Fund: These funds will be made available to Religious School students who are in need of tuition assistance, as determined confidentially by the Treasurer.
- Rabbi's Discretionary Fund: a fund for assistance to families in need, scholarship assistance, interfaith council, Holocaust museum and other endeavors at the Rabbi's discretion.
- Youth Group Fund: a fund that supports the ongoing engagement of post b'nai mitzvah youth, providing meaningful and fun experiences for our teens, and keeping them connected to their Jewish community

If you wish to designate a gift to a particular purpose, for example, Food Bank, Choir, Oneg, Social Action, etc., you may do so by noting as such on your payment method or with an accompanying note; otherwise, your gift will be used where it is needed most.

Opportunities:

- Adopt-A-Book: A dedication label will be placed in one of our prayer books, to commemorate a simcha or in honor or memory of a loved one for just \$54.
- Bricklets: For as little as \$9 you can send a Bricklet Card instead of buying a card for birthdays, condolences, etc. A Bricklet Card in your name will be sent to the person you wish stating that a donation has been made in his or her name to Beth Shalom to honor the occasion.
- **Tree of Life**: The Tree of Life is on the back wall of our Sanctuary. An engraved leaf or stone can commemorate many simchas, b'nai mitzvah, wedding, birth, graduations, etc. Leaves are \$180, and stones are \$1800.
- Yahrzeit Plaque: To honor the death of a loved one, you may purchase a plaque that will be cared for in perpetuity for \$250. The name of the deceased along with their date of death is included on the plaque.
