From the Rabbi

Summer Vacation Edition!

For some of us, summertime is a continuation of our regular routine - just hotter! For some it is a time to escape the Florida heat to visit friends, relatives or return to a summer residence. And for others, it is a time to take vacation to a far-flung destination or enjoy a few days of 'staycation' close to home.



Congregation Beth Shalom is more than a building. Whatever you do, or wherever you go, you are a still a part of our community. We would love to hear about your summer – whether it is a special trip or a local outing. (And based on past experience, you may well run into other members wherever you are – even in Alaska!) A number of years ago, we encouraged our members to take a picture of themselves on vacation with *The Kibbitzer* and post it on our Facebook page. I want to encourage you to do this again. It is a wonderful way for our community to stay connected, get to know each other better, share in joys and adventures. For the many of you who get *The Kibbitzer* electronically, just print out the first page to hold up, stick it in your bag, and it's ready to go with you wherever you wander.

The nature of 21st century Jewish life is that in many (if not all) of the places we visit, we will find a Jewish community, or an old synagogue, or a Star of David on a building that was once a Jewish gathering place. Many of you return from trips sharing with me what you saw and learned about Jewish life on your travels. Such experiences provide a unique view of Jewish history and contemporary Judaism. Many years ago, Larry Milder wrote a song called, "Wherever you Go" that sums this up. Here are a few of the lyrics; you can search on YouTube to hear the actual song:

"Wherever you go,
There's always someone Jewish.
You're never alone when you say you're a Jew.
So when you're not home, and you're somewhere kind of newish,
The odds are, don't look far – 'cause they're Jewish, too.

Some Jews live in tents, and some live in pagodas, And some Jews pay rent, 'cause the city's not free. Some Jews live on farms in the hills of Minnesota, And some Jews wear no shoes, and live by the sea.

Amsterdam, Disneyland, Tel Aviv – oh, they're miles apart, But when we light the candles on Sabbath eve, We share in the prayer in each one of our hearts."

FROM THE PRESIDENT - David Friedman

In May, Carol Anne and I spent a few days in Newport, R.I. We did a lot of sightseeing, enjoyed some nice restaurants, and enjoyed the cooler temperatures. We also toured a couple of mansions - The Elms, and the more famous - The Breakers. Though The Breakers is the largest and most visited mansion on the island, we found both to be truly amazing to behold. You can't help but marvel at the architecture, the artwork, statues, tapestries, and perhaps, even the way of life. Both are masterpieces.

We saw another masterpiece on the island - a 500 year old Torah. We saw this at the oldest synagogue in the country – Touro Synagogue. This marvel, pictured below, was dedicated two- and-a-half centuries ago and has become "the physical embodiment of the ideals of religious freedom and of the American Jewish experiment."

Here's a brief history. Many Jews fled the inquisition ("fleeing" should be an Olympic event!) and wound up in the colonies of the New World. The first group of settlers to come to Newport arrived in 1658. Those settlers founded Congregation Jeshuat Israel, which means "Salvation of Israel." Isaac Touro became the first spiritual leader of Jeshuat Israel in 1758. In 1759, the congregation bought some land and hired Peter Harrison to design the synagogue.

For the exterior, Harrison drew from his knowledge of "Palladian" architecture, which was a popular European style. For the interior, he actually took direction from the congregants, mainly, Isaac Touro, who had recently arrived from Amsterdam. Each of the columns you see in the photo were made from single oak trees. The features at the tops of the columns and the use of dentil molding reflect European influences.

The building was completed in 1763 and is situated on the land, at an angle. This was necessary in order for the congregation to face east.

Though the British captured Newport during the Revolutionary war, the synagogue was spared because the British used it as a hospital.

In August of 1790, George Washington made a "goodwill" visit to Rhode Island. This was after Rhode Island had finally ratified the Constitution. On Aug. 17, he, along with the other dignitaries traveling with him, spent the night in Newport. The next morning, representatives from various religious groups presented letters of welcome to the president. Among them was the leader of the Jewish congregation, Moses Seixas. In his letter, Moses expressed the hope that this new country would accord all of its citizens respect and tolerance, whatever their background and religious beliefs. Apparently, this letter moved the president, because he responded a few days later in a letter of his own. He assured the Hebrew congregation that "everyone shall sit in safety under his own vine and fig tree,

and there shall be none to make him afraid."

Washington wrote letters to other religious groups, but the tone of his letter to Moses was different from the others. In this letter, Washington promised not just tolerance, but full liberty of conscience no matter what one's religious beliefs, including none



at all. He was paving the way for the First Amendment, which would be added to the Constitution on Dec. 15, 1791. When you tour this synagogue, they offer you copies of both letters.

Today, weekly services vary according to the season. The synagogue is Orthodox, so the women still sit upstairs, separated from the men. In June, for example, Friday evening services start at 8 p.m., and Saturday morning services begin at 10. By the way, they are looking for an oneg sponsor for the 23rd!

What we refer to as the bimah is actually in the middle of the room. There are rows of benches on all sides of the pulpit, so during services, the Rabbi faces the backs of those men sitting in the front rows.

The 500-year-old Torah scroll, made from deer skin, is encased in Plexiglass for protection, and obviously, is no longer used.

In 1946, Touro Synagogue, as it is now known, was designated a National Historic Site. Two years later, the Touro Foundation was established to aid in the maintenance and upkeep.

The Touro Synagogue is well worth your time to visit. If needed, Carol Anne and I can even recommend a terrific B&B, right down the street!



DONATIONS

Congregation Beth Shalom accepts donations for many purposes, with a variety of opportunities for donors to support the good works of the Temple. You may contact the office either by phone or email to make a contribution, or head to our website to make a secure online payment through a PayPal account or by using a credit card.

Funds

- General Fund (unrestricted): An unrestricted gift to the General Fund allows the temple to use those funds wherever they may be needed most. This fund incorporates contributions received from our High Holy Day Appeal, Yahrzeit donations, Bricklets, Adopt-A-Book, Tree of Life (unless otherwise indicated) and other non-restricted gifts.
- Building Fund: A fund to ensure the continuing physical growth of our spiritual home. Intended for capital improvements and major building repairs.
- Endowment Fund: Gifts to this fund are placed in an investment account and temporarily restricted or can be defined/restricted by the donor. This fund ensures the future of our temple.
- Religious School Scholarship Fund: These funds will be made available to Religious School students who are in need of tuition assistance, as determined confidentially by the Treasurer.
- Rabbi's Discretionary Fund: a fund for assistance to families in need, scholarship assistance, interfaith council, Holocaust museum and other endeavors at the Rabbi's discretion.
- Youth Group Fund: a fund that supports the ongoing engagement of post b'nai mitzvah youth, providing meaningful and fun experiences for our teens, and keeping them connected to their Jewish community

If you wish to designate a gift to a particular purpose, for example, Food Bank, Choir, Oneg, Social Action, etc., you may do so by noting as such on your payment method or with an accompanying note; otherwise, your gift will be used where it is needed most.

Opportunities:

- Adopt-A-Book: A dedication label will be placed in one of our prayer books, to commemorate a simcha or in honor or memory of a loved one for just \$54.
- Bricklets: For as little as \$9 you can send a Bricklet Card instead of buying a card for birthdays, condolences, etc. A Bricklet Card in your name will be sent to the person you wish stating that a donation has been made in his or her name to Beth Shalom to honor the occasion.
- **Tree of Life**: The Tree of Life is on the back wall of our Sanctuary. An engraved leaf or stone can commemorate many simchas, b'nai mitzvah, wedding, birth, graduations, etc. Leaves are \$180, and stones are \$1800.
- Yahrzeit Plaque: To honor the death of a loved one, you may purchase a plaque that will be cared for in perpetuity for \$250. The name of the deceased along with their date of death is included on the plaque.
