A Stranger Doesn't Have To Be A Bad Thing

I have been a stranger in a strange land. A line it seems like everyone in our culture is familiar with. Most of us understand it and as members of a religious minority almost everywhere in the modern world, most of us have experienced it.

I've been one of a few Jews in an entire county and a new member of a synagogue with no family or friends around – both of those situations seemed to fit the bill, at the time. But, did you know that many biblical scholars don't all believe that a "stranger" is all that strange. In fact, "newcomer" has been a very common interpretation of the word. Why should that make a difference? It can actually change how you see your role in a community.

When most people say that they've felt like a stranger in a strange land, it has some negative connotation. A situation someone didn't want to be in; a place to spend as little time as possible. And that feeling was backed up by the bible. At least, that's what most of us assumed.

But a newcomer is more than that. A newcomer is someone looking to stay; a person looking to be a part of something. A newcomer may not have long ties to a community, but they have their own experiences and education. It may be a shot to our egos, but not many communities can survive without newcomers. They are what allow us to grow and get better. Without fresh faces we often can't tell what we've forgotten or know what new things we need to learn ourselves.

But being a stranger or newcomer can still be a menacing proposition. The status quo is not only comfortable but powerful. Untested situations aren't fun for most people involved.

Have you done enough to embrace the "strangers" around us? Have you tried to learn from them rather than just tell them how things have always been done? And when you've been the "newcomer" - did you sit back and let things happen because "it's not your place" or did you try to make an impact and change things for the better? How many new acquaintances have we dismissed because they didn't conform to our norms? How many potential friends/community members have been lost just because it was our way or bust? A stranger doesn't have to be a bad thing.

Looking To The Future

From the Book of Yichezkeil (Ezekial), Chapter 37:

The hand of Adonai came upon me. G-d took me out by the spirit of Adonai and set me down in the valley. It was full of bones. He led me all around them; there were very many of them spread over the valley, and they were very dry. G-d said to me, "O mortal, can these bones live again?" I replied, O Adonai, G-d, only You know. And G-d said to me, "Prophesy over these bones and say to them; O dry bones, hear the word of Adonai! Thus said Adonai, G-d to these bones: I will cause breath to enter you and you shall live again. ... I prophesied as I had been commanded. And while I was prophesying, suddenly there was a sound of rattling, and the bones came together, bone to matching bone. ... Then G-d said to me, "Prophesy to the breath, prophesy, O mortal! Say to the breath: Thus said Adonai, G -d: Come, O breath, from the four winds, and breathe into these slain, that they may live again." I prophesied as G-d commanded me. The breath entered them, and they came to life and stood up on their feet, a vast multitude.

And so it is our congregation, Congregation Beth Shalom as it was with Israel. Yes, as Dave Friedman, our immediate past president noted, in the past two years, we have lost two administrators, lost our High Holy Day cantor, our rabbi and now our religious school administrator. And it seems we are just the dry bones in Yichezkeil's vision. Continuing - And G-d said to me, "O mortal, these bones are the whole House of Israel. They say, 'Our bones are dried up, our hope is gone; we are doomed.' ... "I will put My breath into you and you shall live again, and I will set you upon your own soil. Then you shall know that I Adonai have spoken and have acted,"

declares Adonai.

And so with us; CBS is not one person, not two or three or not even a minyan. It is a community of many, of young and old, the well and the sick, the agile and the feeble - but it is all of us. It is not about seniors versus young families, or the us and them. We are not one homogeneous mass - we are all



different individuals with different needs, goals, wants and hopes. However, we are B'tzelem Elohim - created in the image of G-d. We are divided right now and there are serious concerns and many rumors - many of them either untrue or half-truths.

I want to hear those concerns - all of them. If you want to meet for coffee, lunch, dinner, whatever - at CBS, Starbucks or elsewhere, I want to hear your concerns, your aspirations, your hopes, your doubts and yes, even your fears about CBS. We can agree to disagree, but it is imperative that we go back to our Jewish values - yes, go ahead, argue, disagree, discuss - but we need to do it in love and respect for each other. And we can't dwell on 2017, 2015, 2010 and all of the past with its baggage. We need to collectively look to a future with a new rabbi to rebuild and make CBS a better place than it was before it went through this trauma.







DONATIONS

Congregation Beth Shalom accepts donations for many purposes, with a variety of opportunities for donors to support the good works of the Temple. You may contact the office either by phone or email to make a contribution, or head to our website to make a secure online payment through a PayPal account or by using a credit card.

Funds:

- General Fund (unrestricted): An unrestricted gift to the General Fund allows the temple to use those funds wherever they may be needed most. This fund incorporates contributions received from our High Holy Day Appeal, Yahrzeit donations, Bricklets, Adopt-A-Book, Tree of Life (unless otherwise indicated) and other non-restricted gifts.
- Building Fund: A fund to ensure the continuing physical growth of our spiritual home. Intended for capital improvements and major building repairs.
- Endowment Fund: Gifts to this fund are placed in an investment account and temporarily restricted or can be defined/restricted by the donor. This fund ensures the future of our temple.
- Religious School Scholarship Fund: These funds will be made available to Religious School students who are in need of tuition assistance, as determined confidentially by the Treasurer.
- Rabbi's Discretionary Fund: a fund for assistance to families in need, scholarship assistance, interfaith council, Holocaust museum and other endeavors at the Rabbi's discretion.
- Youth Group Fund: a fund that supports the ongoing engagement of post b'nai mitzvah youth, providing meaningful and fun experiences for our teens, and keeping them connected to their Jewish community.

If you wish to designate a gift to a particular purpose, for example, Food Bank, Choir, Oneg, Social Action, etc., you may do so by noting as such on your payment method or with an accompanying note; otherwise, your gift will be used where it is needed most.

Opportunities:

- Adopt-A-Book: A dedication label will be placed in one of our prayer books, to commemorate a simcha or in honor or memory of a loved one for just \$54.
- Bricklets: For as little as \$9 you can send a Bricklet Card instead of buying a card for birthdays, condolences, etc. A Bricklet Card in your name will be sent to the person you wish stating that a donation has been made in his or her name to Beth Shalom to honor the occasion.
- Tree of Life: The Tree of Life is on the back wall of our Sanctuary. An engraved leaf or stone can commemorate many simchas, b'nai mitzvah, wedding, birth, graduations, etc. Leaves are \$180, and stones are \$1800.
- Yahrzeit Plaque: To honor the death of a loved one, you may purchase a plaque that will be cared for in perpetuity for \$250. The name of the deceased along with their date of death is included on the plaque.

Unless otherwise noted by you, your gift will be acknowledged in the Kibbitzer the month following its receipt. If your donation is incorrectly listed or omitted, please notify the temple office immediately.
