The value of numbers

"Echad, sh'taim, shalosh, arba ..." in my Hebrew class at USF a few years ago we would go around the room and count in Hebrew. If a person said the wrong word for the number it meant the entire group had to start over at one, "echad," and try the sequence again. During the class exercise each person counted and each person was part of the counting.

In the middle of the month of May we begin Bamidbar, or Numbers, in the Torah. This is where the census of the ancient Israelites in the desert begins; the count of available males presumably for battle. Census, ah as a trained statistician I love a great data set. The U.S. Census can tell so much about a community – the gender make-up, educational levels, home ownership, income, it is a virtual smorgasbord of mine-able data. But, to what end?

Often numbers are just that, numbers. Without trained researchers and professionals to interpret the data and make it usable the raw numbers are all we are left with. So, what about our Torah's numbers, the ancient census? What can we make of it?

One of the most notable features is who WASN'T counted: women, children, the aged, the disabled. Were they not just as important? Cantor Rachel S. Spilker writes, "These people are usually missing ... those who are counted have a special worth to the society, while those who are not may be considered less valuable ..." She goes on to question the census all together and states that Rashi explained we must count something each person GIVES rather than the actual people themselves. Rashi's comment teaches us we must value each human because we are made b'tzelem Elohim, in G-d's image.

Cantor Spilker continues, "a number can measure whether an army has enough people, but it can never measure the worth of the individual people of that army."

How do we measure members of our congregation? By the monetary donations they give? By the time they invest? By the friends or "status" they have? If we have someone who gives small dollars but volunteers time, do we treat them differently than those that give big checks but are never seen? What about those who have different views, limited time, or limited dollars? Are they any less valuable, human, or Jewish in our count?

One of the dictionary definitions of the word "count" is to "be significant" to "matter" to "(have) worth." Let's continue to ensure that everyone counts in our congregation.

Those with different views, income, or time do count, because if we leave them out of our counting we in affect discount how much they truly do have to offer and contribute. If we leave people out of our counting we not only do a disservice to them, but to the entire congregation.

After several minutes of CPR, the little boy coughs and opens his eyes.

After having just saved the young boy's life, the man looks at the woman expecting words of gratitude, but instead, she says, "He had as hat."

Sometimes, this is how it is as president. No matter what you do, no matter how much time you invest, no matter

how thin you spread yourself, someone's going to say, "Where's the hat?"

Fortunately, and on a more positive note, when I first sat with past president, Hank Mart, he told me, "There will be people to help you out." What he didn't tell me was, how many people would help me, and to what degree.



In a very short time as president, I learned that this little congregation, called Beth Shalom, has an army. I have been surrounded by an army of people who have stepped up time and time again. They've assisted with membership, fundraising, social action and ritual. When we needed "talent scouts" to step up and assist CBS in finding two administrators, they did! Shavuot combines two major religious observances; the grain harvest of early summer, and the giving of the Ten Commandments at Mount Sinai. This takes the form of the entering into a covenant or formal agreement between G-d and Israel at Mount Sinai. This is a joyous time, since it is the mo-

ment at which G-d and Israel entered into a figurative marriage with each other, the hopeful springtime of their relationship.

Shavuot is the predecessor to the college all-nighters! Going back to the time of the Mystics of Safed, they studied Torah literally all night long. They be-



lieved at midnight the heavens open and favorably receive the thoughts, study, and prayers of those who remain awake on the anniversary of the Giving of the Torah. Moroccan Jews believe that staying up all night guaranteed one life for the next year.

Study options are rampant, although traditionally, they are the Torah and the Book of Ruth. As Shavuot centers on the giving of Torah on Mount Sinai, we will focus on that seminal event that sets us apart as People of the Book — and the four varying versions of the Ten Commandments in the Torah.

Traditionally, dairy products are eaten on Shavuot. Although the reasons for this custom are not completely clear, as Tevye says, "It's a tradition!" So, our potluck dinner will be dairy – although latkes are permitted – parve!





Report on Yom HaShoah and Yom Ha'Atzmaut Events

This April, CBS, through its Ritual Committee, offered new experiences to members, all of which were exciting, free and open to the public.

The first, a joint venture with Joanne Sudman of Congregation Beth Israel, in Sun City Center, focused on Yom HaShoah, the remembrance day for the six million Jews who perished in the Holocaust. Beth Israel helped create this interfaith memorial service which has grown in support and reputation over the last decade, and we were honored to participate this year. As a diverse and inclusive community, we experienced prayer and readings, lit memorial candles, and were moved by an interfaith choir which included Joan Frankel and some of our Kolot Shalom members. It was a wonderful and emotional experience, and I encourage everyone to put May 1, 2019, on their calendars for next year's offering.

This was followed by Beth Shalom's own Diversity Panel experience April 14. Remembering the Holocaust was fueled by the dynamics of discrimination, demonization and marginalization, we invited representative speakers from some of our less mainstream community members: Kathy Dane, Director of the Beth-El Farmworker Ministry in

Wimauma; Pastor Tom Jones of the Genesis Worship Center of Tampa Bay; Dr Karen Goldberg of USF speaking about issues involving the deaf; Mr. Sener Gultekin from the Istanbul Cultural Center teaching us about current events in Turkey; and Ms. Mona Posinoff speaking about issues of the LGBTQ community. Each speaker shared ways in which their group is experiencing a lack of sensitivity to their needs, and proposed changes through which the rest of the community might be more sensitive and inclusive toward them. This was a wonderful, sharing and growthful experience for all of us, and I am very grateful to our speakers for their courage and candor, and to our audience for their receptivity to the information shared.

Finally, we created our own joyful Yom Ha'Atzmaut celebration for Israel's 70th birthday. There was food, games, crafts, activities, Israeli dancing led by Terry Abrahams, music provided by Sandy Santucci, Rob Northrup and Gail Verlin, a bake sale, and a raffle. There was even a model of Jerusalem's Kotel/Western Wall/Wailing Wall that is still up in the sanctuary, where anyone can write a prayer or wish and insert it between the "stones." Our Youth Group, under the direction Mags Oldman, was

a vital component of this endeavor, and we are indebted to them for their help. We hope to make it an annual event.

DONATIONS

Congregation Beth Shalom accepts donations for many purposes, with a variety of opportunities for donors to support the good works of the Temple. You may contact the office either by phone or email to make a contribution, or head to our website to make a secure online payment through a PayPal account or by using a credit card.

Funds:

- General Fund (unrestricted): An unrestricted gift to the General Fund allows the temple to use those funds wherever they may be needed most. This fund incorporates contributions received from our High Holy Day Appeal, Yahrzeit donations, Bricklets, Adopt-A-Book, Tree of Life (unless otherwise indicated) and other non-restricted gifts.
- Building Fund: A fund to ensure the continuing physical growth of our spiritual home. Intended for capital improvements and major building repairs.
- Endowment Fund: Gifts to this fund are placed in an investment account and temporarily restricted or can be defined/ restricted by the donor. This fund ensures the future of our temple.
- Religious School Scholarship Fund: These funds will be made available to Religious School students who are in need of tuition assistance, as determined confidentially by the Treasurer.
- Rabbi's Discretionary Fund: a fund for assistance to families in need, scholarship assistance, interfaith council, Holocaust museum and other endeavors at the Rabbi's discretion.
- Youth Group Fund: a fund that supports the ongoing engagement of post b'nai mitzvah youth, providing meaningful and fun experiences for our teens, and keeping them connected to their Jewish community.

If you wish to designate a gift to a particular purpose, for example, Food Bank, Choir, Oneg, Social Action, etc., you may do so by noting as such on your payment method or with an accompanying note; otherwise, your gift will be used where it is needed most.

Opportunities:

- Adopt-A-Book: A dedication label will be placed in one of our prayer books, to commemorate a simcha or in honor or memory of a loved one for just \$54.
- Bricklets: For as little as \$9 you can send a Bricklet Card instead of buying a card for birthdays, condolences, etc. A Bricklet Card in your name will be sent to the person you wish stating that a donation has been made in his or her name to Beth Shalom to honor the occasion.
- Tree of Life: The Tree of Life is on the back wall of our Sanctuary. An engraved leaf or stone can commemorate many simchas, b'nai mitzvah, wedding, birth, graduations, etc. Leaves are \$180, and stones are \$1800.
- Yahrzeit Plaque: To honor the death of a loved one, you may purchase a plaque that will be cared for in perpetuity for \$250. The name of the deceased along with their date of death is included on the plaque.
