# From the Rabbi

# Learning About Ourselves . . .

I was recently invited to speak to a class at a local high school that was studying the Holocaust. The teacher wanted me to speak not only about the Holocaust but also about Judaism and Jewish life today so the students would know something about those who were victims of the Nazis. One of the questions they asked was about the different kinds of Jews – from those who wear black hats to those who look just as they do. It's always



hard to express the difference between Orthodox, Conservative and Reform Judaism in just a few sentences. But one of the things I always say is that Reform Judaism balances the traditions we've been given with the desire to be part of the modern world and that each Jew has to make an informed choice about how to do this.

"Informed choice" has always been a central feature of Reform Judaism. This is true about how we observe the holidays and Shabbat, what we choose to eat, what ritual garments we chose to wear in the synagogue. I think of this every time I am asked by someone to explain what we do in the service – cover our eyes, bow, wear a tallit – because, as someone said recently "I don't know what I am supposed to do." "Supposed to do." Of course, there are norms of Jewish practice we hope everyone will embrace. However, when it comes to prayer practice, especially the "choreography" of the service, the quest is for individual meaning in worship, not expected behavior. It is hard to be open to meaning if we are looking around feeling left out or as if everyone else knows what to do. It is hard to make an "informed choice" if we are not even sure what the choice is! While there are notes in the book about many things, it helps to have a chance to learn in depth and ask questions. On Friday, Nov. 10, our Shabbat service will be a learner's service. It will be an opportunity to learn about the service, why we do what we do and the nature of different customs and traditions. Come learn about the various ways you might connect to prayer... so that you can make an informed choice.

# And Learning About Others . . .

Our Interfaith Meet-Up at the end of August was a wonderful opportunity to gather together members of the Christian and Muslim community to begin to build bridges. Members of the Istanbul Cultural Center and a number of local churches joined members of CBS to learn about the Jewish New Year traditions and - more importantly – begin the process of getting to know each other. In their feedback, participants all echoed a similar sentiment: a desire to build meaningful relationships, an interest in opportunities to learn about one another, and a commitment to working together on projects of significance in the community. We hope this will include visiting other places of worship, learning together and from each other about issues of common concern, and doing the "mitzvah" work that is central to all faith, no matter what label we use. Our CBS committee will be looking at possible events and inviting others from the faith communities to join us in thoughtful planning for the future. In our multicultural and diverse world, understanding others is not an option. It is essential path to creating a world in which we can be secure in who we are knowing that we stand together in our quest for unity and peace.

May you all have a meaningful and joy filled Thansgiving.

He couldn't find his ticket, so he reached in his trouser pockets. It wasn't there. He looked in his briefcase but couldn't find it. Then he looked in the seat beside him. He still couldn't find it.

The conductor said, "Dr. Einstein, I know who you are. We all know who you are. I'm sure you bought a ticket. Don't worry about it."

Einstein nodded appreciatively. The conductor continued down the aisle punching tickets. 




# **PAGE TURNERS**

She wanted to understand what kept these holidays alive and vibrant, in some cases for thousands of years. Her curiosity led her




The next Page Turners meeting will be Monday, Nov. 20, at 6 p.m.

# RABBI SEARCH - Sheila Fishman

As previously reported, we are moving along two tracks. Regarding seating a permanent rabbi effective with July 1, we have met and reviewed the information obtained from the congregational meeting. Those comments repeatedly mentioned by the attendees were identified and were entered on the rabbinic application. We submitted the application Thursday, Oct. 5, and it was posted to the Central Conference of American Rabbis (CCAR) members-only website. Interested rabbis will contact the CCAR and submit their resumes. The CCAR will then forward the resumes onto your Rabbi Search Committee. A subgroup of the Rabbi Search Committee has been formed to develop the protocol for interacting with the applicants, evaluating the resumes, interviewing them, and evaluating each applicant's skill set. It is our ultimate goal to identify and select a rabbi for all of Beth Shalom congregants.

Now, regarding our needs January through June, I have great news. We have identified two individuals who will be providing spiritual leadership. Rabbi Richard Address agreed to assist us during this initial period. We are very fortunate to have Rabbi Address with us as his credentials are amazing. He served for more than three decades on the staff of the Union for Reform Judaism--first as a Regional Director and



then as the Founder and Director of the URJ's Department of Jewish Family Concerns. He subsequently served as a specialist and consultant for the North American Reform Movement in the areas of family-related programming. During those years, he also served several congregations. He is the founder and director of www.jewishsacredaging.com. Currently, Rabbi Address contributes articles for websites on issues related to spirituality and aging, serves as Rabbinic Advisor to Men of Reform Judaism, and hosts a weekly radio show called "Boomer Generation Radio."





# **DONATIONS**

Congregation Beth Shalom accepts donations for many purposes, with a variety of opportunities for donors to support the good works of the Temple. You may contact the office either by phone or email to make a contribution, or head to our website to make a secure online payment through a PayPal account or by using a credit card.

### Funds:

- General Fund (unrestricted): An unrestricted gift to the General Fund allows the temple to use those funds wherever they may be needed most. This fund incorporates contributions received from our High Holy Day Appeal, Yahrzeit donations, Bricklets, Adopt-A-Book, Tree of Life (unless otherwise indicated) and other non-restricted gifts.
- Building Fund: A fund to ensure the continuing physical growth of our spiritual home. Intended for capital improvements and major building repairs.
- Endowment Fund: Gifts to this fund are placed in an investment account and temporarily restricted or can be defined/ restricted by the donor. This fund ensures the future of our temple.
- Religious School Scholarship Fund: These funds will be made available to Religious School students who are in need of tuition assistance, as determined confidentially by the Treasurer.
- Rabbi's Discretionary Fund: a fund for assistance to families in need, scholarship assistance, interfaith council, Holocaust museum and other endeavors at the Rabbi's discretion.
- Youth Group Fund: a fund that supports the ongoing engagement of post b'nai mitzvah youth, providing meaningful and fun experiences for our teens, and keeping them connected to their Jewish community.

If you wish to designate a gift to a particular purpose, for example, Food Bank, Choir, Oneg, Social Action, etc., you may do so by noting as such on your payment method or with an accompanying note; otherwise, your gift will be used where it is needed most.

# **Opportunities:**

- Adopt-A-Book: A dedication label will be placed in one of our prayer books, to commemorate a simcha or in honor or memory of a loved one for just \$54.
- Bricklets: For as little as \$9 you can send a Bricklet Card instead of buying a card for birthdays, condolences, etc. A Bricklet Card in your name will be sent to the person you wish stating that a donation has been made in his or her name to Beth Shalom to honor the occasion.
- **Tree of Life**: The Tree of Life is on the back wall of our Sanctuary. An engraved leaf or stone can commemorate many simchas, b'nai mitzvah, wedding, birth, graduations, etc. Leaves are \$180, and stones are \$1800.
- Yahrzeit Plaque: To honor the death of a loved one, you may purchase a plaque that will be cared for in perpetuity for \$250. The name of the deceased along with their date of death is included on the plaque.

Unless otherwise noted by you, your gift will be acknowledged in the Kibbitzer the month following its receipt. If your donation is incorrectly listed or omitted, please notify the temple office immediately.
