

From the Rabbi

Do You Know Your Fellow Members?

This is one of the busiest months of the Jewish year, with four major holidays, several of which extend over more than one day. The intensity is often overwhelming — both because of the significance of the themes and the sheer quantity of celebrations! But this year at Beth Shalom, all of our Holy Days share a common theme. They will each, in different ways, help



How will we do that? For the first time, everyone has been sent a name tag (with the schedule of services on the back) in your High Holy Days packet. For security reasons, you need to bring it – but we hope you will also chose to wear it! It is a gateway, an opportunity to form a connection. Knowing someone's name is a first small step toward getting to know who he or she really is – an essential element of a community.

On Shabbat Shuvah (Oct. 7) our annual "I am Jewish" panel will allow us to get to know three congregants in a more in-depth fashion. Taken from the last words spoken by *Wall Street Journal* reporter Daniel Pearl before he was killed in Pakistan in 2002, this panel allows three members to share what is important and meaningful to them about their Jewish lives and identities. Dan Miller, Jan Golden and Sheryl Finke are our panelists this year, representing many different aspects of our congregation. Please join us to hear their stories.

In addition to our wonderful Sukkot celebrations such as Sukkah Under the Stars, two new celebrations will provide an opportunity to mingle in a casual way thanks to efforts of our members. Steve Slavkin will lead a wine-tasting of Israeli wines on first night of Sukkot (Oct. 16), and Jay Bolnick will welcome us to his 80-acre ranch in Seffner for Shabbat @ the Ranch (Oct. 21). We'll have Shabbat outside, after watching the sun go down. Dress casually, have a nosh — meet a fellow congregant while petting an alpaca!

And finally, on Simchat Torah we celebrate the joyousness of Torah by singing and dancing, unrolling the entire scroll. This year, we are also doing a "guess the member" contest. Send in a photo of yourself when you were 13 and we'll have a contest to guess who's who. Get to know our congregants as they were "way back when." And – for added fun – wear an item of clothing from the decade in which you turned 13!

From the beginning of Tishrei (October) until the end, learn names, faces and stories, experience our members leading, teaching and opening their homes, laugh together in casual indoor and outdoor settings, and look for familiar faces in old photos. Oh – and celebrate Rosh Hashanah, Yom Kippur, Shabbat, Sukkot and Simchat Torah too!

With this major election year, we have invited candidates from both parties to present their positions on very important issues. These were the last words of Wall Street Journalist Daniel Pearl, who was brutally murdered in Pakistan in 2002. His parents have edited a collection of essays on Jewish identity, entitled I am Jewish. This year, Dan Miller, Jan Golden and Sheryl Finke will be the three panelists who will reflect on what the words "I am Jewish" mean to them as part of our service on this special Shabbat on Friday, Oct. 7.

Donations

Congregation Beth Shalom accepts donations for many purposes, with a variety of opportunities for donors to support the good works of the Temple. You may contact the office either by phone or email to make a contribution, or head to our website to make a secure online payment through a PayPal account or by using a credit card.

Funds:

- General Fund (unrestricted): An unrestricted gift to the General Fund allows the temple to use those funds wherever they may be needed most. This fund incorporates contributions received from our High Holy Day Appeal, Yahrzeit donations, Bricklets, Adopt-A-Book, Tree of Life (unless otherwise indicated) and other non-restricted gifts.
- Building Fund: A fund to ensure the continuing physical growth of our spiritual home. Intended for capital improvements and major building repairs.
- Endowment Fund: Gifts to this fund are placed in an investment account and temporarily restricted or can be defined/restricted by the donor. This fund ensures the future of our temple.
- Religious School Scholarship Fund: These funds will be made available to Religious School students who are in need of tuition assistance, as determined confidentially by the Treasurer.
- Rabbi's Discretionary Fund: a fund for assistance to families in need, scholarship assistance, interfaith council, Holocaust museum and other endeavors at the Rabbi's discretion.
- Youth Group Fund: a fund that supports the ongoing engagement of post b'nai mitzvah youth, providing meaningful and fun experiences for our teens, and keeping them connected to their Jewish community.

If you wish to designate a gift to a particular purpose, for example, Food Bank, Choir, Oneg, Social Action, etc., you may do so by noting as such on your payment method or with an accompanying note; otherwise, your gift will be used where it is needed most.

Opportunities:

- Adopt-A-Book: A dedication label will be placed in one of our prayer books, to commemorate a simcha or in honor or memory of a loved one for just \$54.
- Bricklets: For as little as \$9 you can send a Bricklet Card instead of buying a card for birthdays, condolences, etc. A Bricklet Card in your name will be sent to the person you wish stating that a donation has been made in his or her name to Beth Shalom to honor the occasion.
- Tree of Life: The Tree of Life is on the back wall of our Sanctuary. An engraved leaf or stone can commemorate many simchas, b'nai mitzvah, wedding, birth, graduations, etc. Leaves are \$180, and stones are \$1800.
- Yahrzeit Plaque: To honor the death of a loved one, you may purchase a plaque that will be cared for in perpetuity for \$250. The name of the deceased along with their date of death is included on the plaque.

Unless otherwise noted by you, your gift will be acknowledged in the Kibbitzer the month following its receipt. If your donation is incorrectly listed or omitted, please notify the temple office immediately.


