From the Rabbi *By: Rabbi Betsy Torop*

It's the Journey, not the Destination, that Matters Most

“Standing on the parted shores of history, we still believe what we were taught before ever we stood at Sinai’s foot; that wherever we go, it is eternally Egypt; that there is a better place, a promised land; that the winding way to that promise passes through the wilderness. That there is no way to get from here to there except by joining hands, marching together.” (Michael Waltzer, in *Mishkan T’filah*.) What does this reading, often part of our Erev Shabbat service, teach us?

First, we are often in Egypt – in a place where we are uncertain and afraid, and struggle and difficulty are inevitably part of our lives. But that is not the sum total of our experience. Hope – a better place, a promised land – exists. And though our journey may sometimes involve a few wrong turns, we can move toward better and brighter things if we join hands and work toward that better future together. Our hope for growth and achievement, our journey taken hand in hand – this is the foundation of a life of meaning. This message resonates in particular in this month of transitions when we celebrate the confirmation of eleven 10th graders, when we bless our high school graduates, and when we mark a transition to a new board and president.

Confirmation is a milestone for our 10th graders, a marker on their ongoing journey as Jews. Having spent three years after Bar/Bat Mitzvah discussing Jewish ethics and values, contemporary dilemmas and major Jewish ideas, our 10th graders will share their thoughts about God, Torah and Israel during Confirmation on May 9. Their thoughts reflect their diversity of views and honest wrestling with important ideas. This is not the destination... but a step on the journey that will take each of them in many directions, and we are all privileged to be able to share in the occasion.

High school graduation is also a milestone, the end of one stage and the beginning of the next. These students are looking toward bright futures, a promised land of independence and challenge, opportunity and success. It is safe to say that for many, if not all of them, their future will be filled with twists and turns, and there will be some wandering in the wilderness. In blessing them from the bima at a Shabbat service on May 16, we remind them that they are not alone in this journey, that not only their parents but their community stands with them, joining hands to support them on their way.

And on May 30, we welcome a new Temple board, under the leadership of Jeff Newman, and wish them strength and blessing in their service to our congregation and the Jewish people. It is a sacred calling to serve as a synagogue leader – full of challenge and frustration, joy and satisfaction. In their willingness to step forward, Temple leaders affirm their belief that there is a better place, a promised land. Our community can grow ever stronger as a place of meaningful relationships, a place that fosters Jewish learning and celebration, a place that passes on our traditions to a new generation. And that the way to achieve this vision, to reach this promised land, is by “joining hand and marching together.”

This is a month of transitions, of celebrations, of milestones on journeys for people of all ages. Please plan to join us!



From the President - Hank Mart

My hat's off to Rabbi Torop, Bonnie Karr, Mags Oldman, and all the others who gave of themselves in preparation for a truly superb Pesach Sedar! During this delightful evening, Jews from all demographics relived what our ancestors had to go through during their exodus from Egypt. The Rabbi told stories, we sang songs and enjoyed a wonderful meal, but most of all we came together as a vibrant Jewish community in our little *schul* right here in Brandon, Florida! I truly had a GREAT time!

Now it is time for the rest of the story (who said that?). This article is the concluding piece on the series discussing the word "TEAM." We are on the last letter "M" representing "More; as in "Together Everyone Achieves More."

Congregation Beth Shalom has come a long way since it was first formed nearly 25 years ago. Just a few Jewish families met at someone's home for Shabbat, probably at Sandy Santucci's home or at Toby Koch's home. And then a few more families joined this small gathering of Jews. The small gathering of Jews grew and grew until they needed another meeting place. They were able to get together at Apostles Lutheran Church for many years, but this wasn't a place they could call home. So they saved and saved, until finally they had enough money for a down payment to purchase a home of their own. They were finally free.

The meaning here is that this didn't happen overnight. Through teamwork, the Jews in Eastern Hillsborough County focused their efforts, put aside their differences, worked together, and were able to achieve **more** than was thought possible.

Fast forward to where we are today. We have a beautiful

campus. Thanks to the many families who either gave of their time, gave their money, gave of their talents or all three. This place we call the Temple or the synagogue allows us to have a place to conduct worship services, classrooms for our religious school, meeting rooms for the adult education classes. It also facilitates other programs such as CBS Players, the Noshfesters, the Page Tuners, Yarn Mavens, Torah Tots, and Youth Group, just to name a few. In order to illustrate where we have come from to where we want to go, I am providing you with a snapshot of the congregation's fiscal demographics. (See table.)



The obvious conclusion noted from these figures is that we could achieve so much more if everyone put forth their fair share and took action to eliminate all dues owed schul. Remember it is our Temple's mission is to help and encourage each member of the congregation to participate in our synagogue, thus enhancing his/her own life through *Torah* (Study), *Avodah* (worship), and *Gemilut Chasadim* (deeds of love and kindness). We do this by our commitment.

In order to achieve our mission, each of us has the annual responsibility to self-assess our temple commitment and thereby reaffirm our connection to and support for Congregation Beth Shalom. The temple is not only where we turn to fulfill our individual Jewish needs; it is a vital communal and educational institution. *(Continued on page 5)*

Israel Connections... Meet Yuval Freinle

Many members of Beth Shalom do amazing things both at the Temple and in their personal lives, and Yuval Freinle is no exception. Yuval, a member of our board, Youth Group, Social Action Committee, and our resident gardener, recently made Aliyah to Israel. He was kind enough in the midst of his preparations to be interviewed for this article; here are excerpts from our conversation.

CGH: Please tell our members a little about you.

YF: I was born in Tulsa, OK but grew up in Brandon and went to Brandon High. I went to the HCC Honors Institute after high school and then to Florida State University to study political science on the Bright Futures Scholarship. I realized politics was not in my future so I got a job working at a hotel.

CGH: You visited Israel in 2012. Can you tell us about that trip?

YF: I've made three visits to Israel so far. The first was through the Taglit/Birthright program. I chose to go with Israel Outdoors on a hiking-focused trip. I'm so glad I chose that because I really connected to the land of Israel. My second trip I owe to Rabbi Torop. She forwarded an email about Kibbutz Lotan's Green Apprenticeship program. I spent five months living on a traditional kibbutz studying the environment and Torah — and milking goats! This trip helped me decide I was going to make Aliyah when I turned 35 or before. My third trip was with the Jewish National Fund's Alternative Spring Break program. The more time I spent in Israel, the more at home I felt. The mindset of most Israelis still seems to embrace that there is a county to be built and things to be done together.

CGH: Where will you be living, and what will you be doing when you get there?

YF: Nefesh B'Nefesh is an organization whose goal is to help North American Jews make Aliyah. You get to choose where you live, and Israel offers a welcome basket to help all new immigrants their first year. I chose to settle in southern Israel. I'm 95% sure I'll be going to a kibbutz and my first priority is to enter an Ulpan (Hebrew language course) as soon as I can.

CGH: What do you think will be the biggest adjustment you will have to make?

YF: HEBREW!

CGH: You are probably the only person in Brandon to make Aliyah in a long time, if ever. How do you feel about that?

YF: You know, I had not thought of that this whole time! Truthfully, I'm not sure how to feel about it. On one hand, I would love to encourage everyone to make Aliyah. But, on the other hand, CBS truly is growing every day into a larger and loving community.

CGH: Do you feel that you are a role model for Jewish youth?

YF: Working with the Temple Youth Group really has inspired my life in many ways. To see CBS care enough about the needs of their youth just warms my heart. I think the youth are more of role models for me than I could have ever hoped to be for them — for that, I'm truly thankful.

CGH: How has Beth Shalom been a part of your life?

YF: What a question! And where to start! CBS has been so much to me. Rabbi Torop has been a spiritual teacher when I needed to learn and a healer in times of need. People at CBS are like surrogate family members. I have more mothers and fathers, brothers and sisters than I could have hoped for! Even in the youth I see aspects I hope and pray my own children will have. I truly hope to see my CBS family many more times — when I come back to visit AND when they come to Israel!

Author's note: This interview took place in December 2013. Yuval is currently on Kibbutz Mishmar HaSharon in an Ulpan program. He attends Hebrew class 20 hours a week and works on the kibbutz 20 hours a week. The kibbutz is pre-Statehood and is located on land owned by Arabs. The kibbutz is no longer socialistic in the original form of a kibbutz. He will be there until July 2014. Follow Yuval's adventures in Israel on his blog: <https://mfreinle.wordpress.com>

Selections will include sacred texts and folk songs of Israeli origin as well as popular Broadway show tunes.



TempleKeeping Tips
Safety & Security at CBS

Congregation Beth Shalom is a thriving, growing synagogue, full of people of all ages coming and going every day, all week, every month and all year! Just as it should be! Creating and maintaining a safe, secure environment is paramount to our growth as a spiritual home for our congregants and the community.



TempleKeeping Tips

The temple has practices in place to increase our safety. We have highlighted a few of our most important ones here to remind everyone of how they work.

Drop-off/Pick-up

Children should not be dropped off without the parent knowing there is an attending adult on site who is scheduled to be there. Just because vehicles on are on site does not mean there is a supervisor available for your child. Conversely, they should also be picked up in a timely fashion so that the supervising adult can get to his or her next appointment. Our teachers and staff will not leave a child unattended, so please be respectful of their time, as they are of yours.

Building Access

During the day the temple is kept locked from the outside. To access the facility during operating hours, please use the Administrative Entrance door and ring the bell. It is also a good idea to call the temple first to let us know you are coming if you do not already have an appointment.

Vehicles

Please do not leave your vehicle unattended in the parking lot without notifying staff. A standard practice among group facilities is to report unfamiliar vehicles that are parked in your lot without knowledge. An unknown vehicle is a standard red flag in the world of security, and your vehicle will be reported to the police and possibly towed if it is left without notice.

Assistance

If you notice a light not working, or an exterior camera visibly broken, please notify the office. We strive to keep all of our safety equipment (including fire extinguishers, security cameras, lighting, etc.) in working order. Don't be afraid to notify the office or assume that it is necessarily being fixed. It's possible that something has broken during a time when the facility is unattended. It's always better to assume that someone doesn't know than to think, "Oh, someone else will take care of it."

These are just some of the everyday practices in which we hope our entire congregation can play an active role. Working together to ensure our communal safety is important to everyone. 



Donations

Congregation Beth Shalom accepts donations for many purposes, with a variety of opportunities for donors to support the good works of the Temple. You may contact the office either by phone or email to make a contribution, or head to our website to make a secure online payment through a PayPal account or by using a credit card.

Funds:

- **General Fund** (unrestricted): An unrestricted gift to the General Fund allows the temple to use those funds wherever they may be needed most. This fund incorporates contributions received from our High Holy Day Appeal, Yahrzeit donations, Bricklets, Adopt-A-Book, Tree of Life (unless otherwise indicated) and other non-restricted gifts.
- **Building Fund:** A fund to ensure the continuing physical growth of our spiritual home. Intended for capital improvements and major building repairs.
- **Endowment Fund:** Gifts to this fund are placed in an investment account and temporarily restricted or can be defined/restricted by the donor. This fund ensures the future of our temple.
- **Religious School Scholarship Fund:** These funds will be made available to Religious School students who are in need of tuition assistance, as determined confidentially by the Treasurer.
- **Rabbi's Discretionary Fund:** a fund for assistance to families in need, scholarship assistance, interfaith council, Holocaust museum and other endeavors at the Rabbi's discretion.

If you wish to designate a gift to a particular purpose, for example, Food Bank, Choir, Oneg, Social Action, etc., you may do so by noting as such on your payment method or with an accompanying note; otherwise, your gift will be used where it is needed most.

Opportunities:

- **Adopt-A-Book:** A dedication label will be placed in one of our prayer books, to commemorate a simcha or in honor or memory of a loved one for just \$54.
- **Bricklets:** For as little as \$9 you can send a Bricklet Card instead of buying a card for birthdays, condolences, etc. A Bricklet Card in your name will be sent to the person you wish stating that a donation has been made in his or her name to Beth Shalom to honor the occasion.
- **Tree of Life:** The Tree of Life is on the back wall of our Sanctuary. An engraved leaf or stone can commemorate many simchas, b'nai mitzvah, wedding, birth, graduations, etc. Leaves are \$180 and stones are \$1800.
- **Yahrzeit Plaque:** To honor the death of a loved one, you may purchase a plaque that will be cared for in perpetuity for \$250. The name of the deceased along with their date of death is included on the plaque.


