FROM THE RABBI - Rabbi Bryan Mann

The Value of Radical Openness Even When Feeling Hurt

"This is the bread of affliction ... let all who are hungry come eat." We say these words toward the beginning of our Passover Seders when we break the middle matzah. They are powerful words that remind us of our vulnerability and of our obligation to the world.



"This is the bread of affliction": a reminder of the moment we fled

for our lives from Egyptian oppressors. Perhaps for some in our congregational family a reminder when our family, friends, neighbors, loved ones had to flee from other oppressors and oppressions - literally run for their lives in order to ensure safety and security for themselves, their family, their loved ones.

When I am reminded there are people in this world who want to hurt me or perhaps even kill me simply because of my religion or any other aspect of my identity, the last thing I want to say is, "Let all who are hungry come and eat." What if the person who is hungry is one of those people wishing to do me harm?

Yet, that is what the ritual of the Passover Seder tells us to do. Moments after being reminded of our pain, our hurt, our trauma, we say the words, "Let all who are hungry come and eat." I have been at Seders where the door is wide open the entire time. I have been to Seders where the leader gets up in this moment to open the door. In other words, for some it is not enough to simply say these words. We need to enact them. We need to mean them. We need to open the door and say to anyone within ear shot, "Hey, if you are hungry. If you do not have enough to eat right now. Come. Join us. You are invited to this meal."

By putting these phrases together, we are invited to say, "Yes, I have been hurt. Yes, this pain may be years or even generations old, but it is still with me. I want to ensure others do not feel this pain. I want others to live in a world where they are invited in to join in food, conversation, and ritual."

It also may push our comfort zones. So often pain and trauma cause us to isolate ourselves, to say to ourselves, "I only feel safe with these people or at this place." When we've been hurt, so often we are more on guard than we were before. The Passover Seder comes to say, "I know you are hurting. I know it is incredibly hard to trust those outside your immediate circle. I know it is incredibly hard to let someone in right now, and I would still like you to try.

Depending on the extent of our hurt and our pain this year, all we might be able to manage is the symbolic gesture of opening the door just a crack for the few seconds it takes to say, "Let all who are hungry come eat." For others, you may be able to keep your door wide open for the entire Seder. Wherever we are at on our healing journeys, I see this moment of the Passover Seder as an important reminder that even when we are hurting, even when we are in a vulnerable place, we need to be mindful of and care for others who are hurting.

Take pleasure in giving

Last month, as I started to write this column, I was in New Jersey, awaiting a snow storm, watching an Erev Shabbat service at Congregation Beth Shalom on Facebook. I remember the rabbi's sermon, in which he talked about how Moses asked the Israelites to bring gifts of gold, silver and copper ... to be used for building the mishkan, or sanctuary. These special gifts were in addition to the half shekel that was collected from every adult male (Exodus, 30:11-16). Everyone had to contribute something, but beyond the half shekel, they gave according to what they had. They contributed what they could beyond the half shekel.

How similar this biblical story is to the situation we find ourselves in today. The half shekel we might say is the equivalent of our dues. Every member of our synagogue, just like in biblical times, is expected to contribute something, if possible, in order to have a place in which to pray, learn, celebrate mitzvahs, educate our children and observe community. But we also need those special gifts, the "gold, silver and copper," to sustain and maintain that which we already have and to help provide for our many future needs.

You may ask, "Why is this necessary? I am paying what I can in dues every month; isn't that enough?" As important as those regular contributions are and as grateful as we are for them, the sad fact is that tuition and fees do not provide us with enough funding to meet the many needs of this congregation, especially regarding maintenance and upkeep of the building. A prime example is our leaking roof, currently covered by a canvas. Our roof will soon need to be replaced.

Why aren't these payments sufficient to sustain us? If we charged enough to meet our total requirements, the cost would be prohibitive for many of our members. Also, some of us are already on a reduced dues schedule. This is a common problem among most religious organizations, both Jewish and non-Jewish. And so those precious gifts of gold, silver and copper are necessary to allow us to fully serve all of our congregants and contribute to the well-being of the community we serve. Indeed, tuition and fees cover only 60% of our current expenses and the balance needs to come from fundraising and we are grateful to those who give what they can.

Of course, today people don't usually bring gifts of gold or silver for tzedakah – monetary donations work just fine. We are blessed with numerous donations from many of our congregants every month – just look in *The Kibbitzer* and you will see how many generous members we have. I want to take this opportunity to thank you for your recent contributions and kind support.

At the same time, I'd like to address those members who may be able to give additional gifts to please consider doing

so. You will be helping CBS fulfill our future obligations and meet the challenges of tomorrow. In this manner we would be giving the donations of those Israelites three millennia ago a new life in our present world. As it is written: "God's presence fills the sanctuary and leads the people throughout their journeys."



I have always taken pleasure in giving, whether it was a gift of monetary value or of precious time. I am sure that you too, will experience this special joy – a bedrock of Judaism – and be justly rewarded as well!







• Tom Fuse: Stunt man in jeans or leather trousers, Tom has a thing for living dangerously and has the scars to prove it.





DONATIONS

Congregation Beth Shalom accepts donations for many purposes, with a variety of opportunities for donors to support the good works of the Temple. You may contact the office either by phone or email to make a contribution, or head to our website to make a secure online payment through a PayPal account or by using a credit card.

Funds:

- General Fund (unrestricted): An unrestricted gift to the General Fund allows the temple to use those funds wherever they may be needed most. This fund incorporates contributions received from our High Holy Day Appeal, Yahrzeit donations, Bricklets, Adopt-A-Book, Tree of Life (unless otherwise indicated) and other non-restricted gifts.
- **Building Fund**: A fund to ensure the continuing physical growth of our spiritual home. Intended for capital improvements and major building repairs.
- Endowment Fund: Gifts to this fund are placed in an investment account and temporarily restricted or can be defined/ restricted by the donor. This fund ensures the future of our temple.
- **Religious School Scholarship Fund:** These funds will be made available to Religious School students who are in need of tuition assistance, as determined confidentially by the Treasurer.
- **Rabbi's Discretionary Fund**: a fund for assistance to families in need, scholarship assistance, interfaith council, Holocaust museum and other endeavors at the Rabbi's discretion.
- Youth Group Fund: a fund that supports the ongoing engagement of post b'nai mitzvah youth, providing meaningful and fun experiences for our teens, and keeping them connected to their Jewish community.

If you wish to designate a gift to a particular purpose, for example, Food Bank, Choir, Oneg, Social Action, etc., you may do so by noting as such on your payment method or with an accompanying note; otherwise, your gift will be used where it is needed most.

Opportunities:

- Adopt-A-Book: A dedication label will be placed in one of our prayer books, to commemorate a simcha or in honor or memory of a loved one for just \$54.
- Bricklets: For as little as \$9 you can send a Bricklet Card instead of buying a card for birthdays, condolences, etc. A Bricklet Card in your name will be sent to the person you wish stating that a donation has been made in his or her name to Beth Shalom to honor the occasion.
- **Tree of Life**: The Tree of Life is on the back wall of our Sanctuary. An engraved leaf or stone can commemorate many simchas, b'nai mitzvah, wedding, birth, graduations, etc. Leaves are \$180, and stones are \$1800.
- **Yahrzeit Plaque**: To honor the death of a loved one, you may purchase a plaque that will be cared for in perpetuity for \$250. The name of the deceased along with their date of death is included on the plaque.


