FROM THE RABBI - Rabbi Paul Schreiber, Reb Tuviah

Dear CBS members and friends,

Shalom, Shalom! I'd like to begin my very first message for *The Kib-bitzer* newsletter with a note of thanksgiving and gratefulness. From the very moment my wife Nancy and I stepped onto the property of Congregation Beth Shalom back in March, we were afforded a welcome we never could have imagined. The smiles, the kind words, and the encouraging remarks all made this first visit a remarkable experience. The members of the selection committee made sure we both had everything we needed prior to, and the day of, our arrival.



Their attention to detail was very much appreciated and helped make the interview process run smoothly for everyone involved. As the congregational members began to file in that Friday evening for the Erev Shabbat service, each and every person gifted us with smiles filled with love. I cannot emphasize enough the effect your acts had on us. This was a conscious decision you made to behave in such a manner. You could have chosen to say a quick hello, offer a cursory glance of welcome, or simply say nothing. But you chose none of the above. Instead, you demonstrated such chesed, such kindness, that our hearts were filled and we knew this was a most special family.

Since this is my introduction to all of you in written form, I feel it is of import to share some of my thoughts, my ideas, and my hopes for the future as your rabbi. I envision Congregation Beth Shalom as a place that can offer so much to each and every soul. At its core, it should be a place where worship flows freely, where the ruach, the spirit, can move and touch each person in just the manner in which that person needs most. Shabbat comes once a week, so perhaps we can see the temple as a type of fueling station, a place where we can come and fill our tanks after a long week. What can we fill it with? Well, first and foremost, we can mine the vast resource we, the Jewish people, have been gifted with: the very words of Torah and all its commentaries. Through weekly messages, liturgical practices, and education classes for adults and children, the learning is an endless path of discovery. With these holy words seeping out of our pores, just think of the impact we can make on the world!

Lastly, we should rejoice with the beautiful children who are such an integral part of our family. L'dor v'dor, from generation to generation, is the method in which Judaism has survived and thrived for thousands of years. It must be the goal of this temple to continue this tradition, sharing the splendor of our heritage and the beauty of our traditions with our precious little ones.

So, there it is, a brief glimpse into just a few of my thoughts. Rather than write a novel, I will simply share my ideas over future newsletters. I thank you for taking the time to read this and I'd like to leave you with one final, and extremely topical thought ...

During these past few months, the world has been dealing with immense challenges relating to the COVID-19 pandemic. CBS has proven Judaism can survive despite the odds by maintaining a consistent service schedule, albeit virtually. Looking back throughout our history, when our ancestors had to deal with a multitude of atrocities and often with no immediate hope for their temple or synagogue's restoration, they forged ahead, keeping Judaism alive. That is exactly what you have done at CBS, and for that you should be very proud. The reality is this: you have responded to the closure of the temple in ways truly reminiscent to that of our ancestors. I very much look forward to meeting each and every one of you and the ability for all of us to gather in our sanctuary. I am quite hopeful it can happen in the not-so-distant future, but one thing I know for sure: we, as a family of faith, continue to make our holy ancestors proud!



What We Learned During Our Unplanned Staycation



Even when our synagogue had no classes or discussion groups, we learned a great deal this spring.

We learned losing access to our total freedom is tantamount to losing a dear friend. We learned the emotional impact of loss of freedom parallels the grieving process following a death. First there is denial, refusal to believe this is re-

ally happening. We all had a life "before." We had plans, expectations, responsibilities, jobs, pleasures, exercise, shopping, social gatherings. And in a few moments, everything was suspended. A state of disbelief prevailed. Then came sadness and anger, intermingled. We may have raged overtly or silently, but the feeling was the same. We missed our friends, our outings. We vocally rebelled at what we could not have or do now, at this moment. Uncertainty as to when it would all end loomed over the world. We learned to Zoom with one another. And then there was the fear, fear of an unseen virus, fear of touching anyone and anything not in our home. We learned to arm ourselves with unusual weaponry--gloves, masks, bleach, antibacterial wipes, and we learned fortifying our isolation with toilet tissue somehow made us feel more secure. But

Our religious school classes are designed to meet the educational needs of children prekindergarten through confirmation. We are continuing our cutting-edge religious school curriculum which has been specifically developed for

Congregation Beth Shalom. During the event, you will have an opportunity to preview the curriculum, review the text books, meet with our returning teachers, and enroll your children in classes.

We are continuing with a once-a-week program beginning with Sunday, Aug. 16, for all grades, and we hope to open

onsite employing all safe-guards to protect the health and wellbeing of our students and teachers. For grades 2-7, school hours continue to be 9:30 a.m. until noon, but our day begins with our worship service at 9:30 a.m. The service is followed by a one-hour Hebrew class and one-hour Judaica class. For students in pre-kindergarten through 1st

grade, following the worship service, these children will engage in diverse activities taking in to account their younger needs. A calendar of classes will be available at the open house.

Religious school fees will remain the same for grades 2-7. The fee is \$325. However, we are offering an early bird price of \$295 if you pay the fee in full no later than Aug. 9. Last year, we re-introduced our Chai Membership, which afforded young families, with children ages 3 to 5, a full membership for \$360, a savings of 80% off standard family dues. It also provides an opportunity for each child in that household to attend religious school for \$100 in the first year. With the subsequent year, the younger children in our pre-kindergarten to 1st grade, fees return to \$200 for the year (and early bird price of \$170) while older grade students revert to the cost reflected above. However, please note, if you find that your family is facing financial difficulties, confidential arrangements can be made to assist with the school fees. We do not want any child left behind in their Jewish journey.

In catering to the needs of our diverse community we continuing "L'Dor Vador" program for students age 11 - 16 who have not had any training and or have not been Bar or Bat Mitzvah. It is our goal to pass on our traditions from generation to generation. This will be a special two-year program culminating with the B'Nai Mitzvah. These students will be meeting during regular religious school hours. With the final 9-months of the program, the students will also be at-





DONATIONS

Congregation Beth Shalom accepts donations for many purposes, with a variety of opportunities for donors to support the good works of the Temple. You may contact the office either by phone or email to make a contribution, or head to our website to make a secure online payment through a PayPal account or by using a credit card.

Funds:

- General Fund (unrestricted): An unrestricted gift to the General Fund allows the temple to use those funds wherever they may be needed most. This fund incorporates contributions received from our High Holy Day Appeal, Yahrzeit donations, Bricklets, Adopt-A-Book, Tree of Life (unless otherwise indicated) and other non-restricted gifts.
- Building Fund: A fund to ensure the continuing physical growth of our spiritual home. Intended for capital improvements and major building repairs.
- Endowment Fund: Gifts to this fund are placed in an investment account and temporarily restricted or can be defined/restricted by the donor. This fund ensures the future of our temple.
- Religious School Scholarship Fund: These funds will be made available to Religious School students who are in need of tuition assistance, as determined confidentially by the Treasurer.
- Rabbi's Discretionary Fund: a fund for assistance to families in need, scholarship assistance, interfaith council, Holocaust museum and other endeavors at the Rabbi's discretion.
- Youth Group Fund: a fund that supports the ongoing engagement of post b'nai mitzvah youth, providing meaningful and fun experiences for our teens, and keeping them connected to their Jewish community.

If you wish to designate a gift to a particular purpose, for example, Food Bank, Choir, Oneg, Social Action, etc., you may do so by noting as such on your payment method or with an accompanying note; otherwise, your gift will be used where it is needed most.

Opportunities:

- Adopt-A-Book: A dedication label will be placed in one of our prayer books, to commemorate a simcha or in honor or memory of a loved one for just \$54.
- Bricklets: For as little as \$9 you can send a Bricklet Card instead of buying a card for birthdays, condolences, etc. A Bricklet Card in your name will be sent to the person you wish stating that a donation has been made in his or her name to Beth Shalom to honor the occasion.
- **Tree of Life**: The Tree of Life is on the back wall of our Sanctuary. An engraved leaf or stone can commemorate many simchas, b'nai mitzvah, wedding, birth, graduations, etc. Leaves are \$180, and stones are \$1800.
- Yahrzeit Plaque: To honor the death of a loved one, you may purchase a plaque that will be cared for in perpetuity for \$350. The name of the deceased along with their date of death is included on the plaque.
